5th Sunday Ordinary Time Year C Luke 5:1-11



"While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.'

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

5th Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C Luke 5:1-1

"Try this......" Have you ever had someone offer unsolicited advice? How open were you to it? We tend not to be so open to being told how to do something differently than we've been doing it already. Because, 'this is the way we have always done it!' But I imagine we have ALL been helped at some time or other, when someone kindly offered a short-cut or work around, letting us in on some tip or inside information that turns out to be so helpful. I see the first apostles experiencing such a 'letting in' on something new and big in the gospel today. A friendly stranger offers the suggestion, "Put out into deep water..." (Luke 5:4) Did Simon roll his eyes thinking, "If we acted on every 'know-it-all's suggestion for the best fishing spot, we'd never get around to catching fish!" Or might he cynically have thought, "if you are so good a fisherman, why isn't your boat out there bringing them in?" But this day, Simon is wiser, either desperate after failing to get bites all night or having been touched earlier with something in Jesus' teaching to the crowds right before this exchange, Simon goes ahead and puts the nets out on the seaboard side of the boat. And not only does Simon catch 'big', but the nets are so full that they are nearly tearing. And after calling a second boat for help hauling the catch in, both boats limp to shore about to sink from the weight of the overwhelming catch!

Simon's response is one of awe and admiration (nearly adoration) as he apologetically falls to his knees, acknowledging Jesus' miraculous authority. Jesus issues a summons of discipleship to them, basically telling them that there are always larger fish to catch if they come with Him. They accept readily (overcoming their pre-catch hesitance). They go with Jesus, following Him and offering as a sign of their commitment, they leave behind their boats, equipment and crews. (Though I like to point out that when we leave something behind for Jesus, it doesn't mean its destruction to us-Jesus will continue to use their prior experience as fishermen. Jesus will even use their equipment again as we will find Jesus often traveling later in boats (and whose boats, but maybe Peter & Company's or business friends'?). Jesus will even take up fishing Himself again (Matt 17:24-27, Jn 21:1-3). So, these first apostles are all in with Jesus. They look forward to the 'greatest catch' ahead of them-they'll net the Kingdon of God with Jesus!

Sometimes people are troubled about Zebedee (James/John's father) seemingly being abandoned. What about 'honoring mother and father'? Of course, Jesus supports the 4th command, to 'honor father and mother'. Keep in mind that He provides for the care of His mother after His death-resurrection-ascension, by pairing 'His Beloved Disciple with His Blessed Mother' to care for each other, when He was on the Cross (John 19:26-27). However, people will often protest that Jesus in another place is harshly dismissive about family responsibilities, when He says, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me" (Matt 10:37). Or another time, when Jesus responds back to a 'would-be' disciple who asked to go bury his father, "Let the dead bury their dead" (Luke 9:59-60). However, we have to keep in mind, the possible 'urgency' in Jesus' emphasis in such cases. Also, Jesus may be checking an individual's exaggerated sense of self-importance (as if they are the sole savior of family matters). So to such difficult words of Jesus, I remind myself that this is the same Jesus who wishes 'salvation' for everyone. He is not going to call me to something that would irrevocably harm someone else, especially family. He loves them so deeply too. In fact, He loves them more than I can! God made them, too, and God wills the best for them, just as He wills the best for me. The problem to face is not the family need calling for attention, but the 'trust' God is calling forth from me. We have to consider that in our response to God, if it is not immediately to family, God will provide for them in His Way. In this case with James and John leaving the fishing industry, we do not know but that Zebedee was about to have a major heart attack or stroke because of working alongside the reckless and risk-taking James & John? I suppose the same applied to Jesus' time as our own time when it comes to 'workplace hazards'. They didn't have an OSHA back then, but according to records, fishing/marine work is consistently the most dangerous occupation year after year (2024 it was 1-fishing, 2-forestry and 3farming). But also, on a lighter note, James and John may have been ready for something outside the family business! But Jesus knows best, and Jesus loves each of us to his/her fulfillment best if we are faithful to Him!

A final encouraging note about discipleship to Jesus. Jesus may call us into water over our heads sometimes. Yet we must trust there, too! We may feel in 'too deep' sometimes when we answer His call. No doubt the apostles in this story were stretched and weighed down. The reading said their 'nets were near tearing' (Lk 5:6) and both boats 'in danger of sinking'. But Jesus prevails. If Jesus calls us to it, He will pull us through it, they say. God will provide, and God's will, be done. We need only answer His call, and Jesus will take care of everything else. Peace, Fr Brian
