This year's Board members have been in office for just over 60 days. These elected volunteers have done a good job transitioning into their Trustee Advisor (TA) assigned areas of responsibility, as well as addressing and dealing with Lost Bridge Village business.

#### COVID-19:

COVID-19 continues to impact all our operations. The first couple of our monthly Board Meetings, which are held on the 3rd Monday of each month starting at 6:00 PM Central, were held by teleconferencing. The May meeting included owner participation for the first time. This has been a new way to manage business for all of us and requires change plus flexibility. We continue to monitor communications on coronavirus related restrictions and protection requirements. Based on this information for now we are keeping the Rec Center with the pool, and the Community Building including the Library, plus the Office closed. We are active in developing operational plans that will be implemented and enforced when these facilities reopen, which maybe in phases.

#### **Pool Opening:**

We have a tentative opening date for just the pool of July 1, 2020, however that is subject to change and following Arkansas State published requirements in addition to CDC requirements.

#### **July 4th Fireworks:**

We are actively developing social distancing and operational plans for the 4th of July Fireworks and will be sending out more information on this in the near future. Lost Bridge Village will hold our Fireworks Show on Saturday July 4, 2020 at the Rec Center shoot site.

On behalf of myself and your Board Members please continue to practice social distancing and follow the protective quidelines from the CDC and above all stay safe. Thank you for your understanding during these times and we are also looking forward to opening our facilities and moving forward.

#### **BURNING ON YOUR OWN PROPERTY**



If you plan to do yard waste burning on your property you **must** get a burn permit beforehand from Benton County. (If you don't and a fire truck comes out because someone reports smoke at your property, you will be charged for the fire service call.) Call **Benton County at 479-273-5530** Burn Ban info can be found on our website: www.lbvca.com. (**Burning of construction materials is prohibited.**) Do not leave smoldering fires unattended!

#### **CLEANING UP YOUR PROPERTY:**

Please remember: Be a good neighbor and rake out leaves and tree debris from your ditches and culverts to prevent water run-off problems, and either burn them or haul them away. If you hire someone to rake leaves or clear other yard waste from your property be sure to tell them to NOT push it into a ditch or culvert or into the street. The property owner can bring them to the Village collection site on Arabian Drive or take it to Inland Waste Service (479-878-1384) for disposal. You will be charged a clean-up fee if LBVCA has to clean out your ditch.

INJURED OR DEAD ANIMALS: To report an injured or dead animal (deer, raccoon, etc.) and have it removed from a <u>state</u> culvert or <u>state</u> road, contact the **Arkansas Game & Fish Department** at 1-866-253-2506. (They'll need the street address of where the animal is located.) If you find a dead animal or deer parts on your property (left behind by hunters or coyotes), you may bury them but <u>NOT</u> burn them (according to the AR Dept. of Environmental Quality).

The Benton County Roads Dept. and Sheriff's Dept. state they have no program in place for picking up dead deer from county roads or culverts. If the animal is lying in a culvert, notify the AR Dept of Environmental Quality at 1-888-233-0326.

#### **VILLAGE ROADS:**

**Green** and **Blue** street signs in the village are county roads. If you live on a road with potholes or ruts, **call Benton County Roads (479-271-1052)** to have it repaired. You do not need to call the Village Office or wait for a Board meeting to report it.

**SPEED LIMIT & PARKING in LBV:** The speed limit throughout the Village is **20 or 25mph** and is enforceable by the Benton County Sheriff's dept. *There is* **no onstreet parking** throughout LBV.

**4-wheelers and ATV's** are not allowed on Benton County roads in the Village.



#### Airport Safety First!

- ONLY AUTHORIZED VEHICLES (EMERGENCY AND MAINTENANCE) ARE ALLOWED ON RUNWAY.
- THE RUNWAY IS ALWAYS ACTIVE. Airplanes typically land with engines throttled back...you may not hear a plane that is landing, especially if you are wearing ear buds.
- AIRPORT MAINTENANCE EQUIPMENT could be operating on or about the runway. Be alert.
- WALKING, JOGGING, BICYCLING, PLAYING ON THE RUNWAY MAY BE DANGEROUS



# BUILDING NEWS Architectural Control Committee

To begin with, would like to shout out a special THANK YOU to all those whom are still working under these uncharted difficult conditions to fill all of our essential needs: grocery store workers, medical staff, restaurant drive-ups, first responders, hardware store folks, law enforcement, road crews, firemen, infrastructure workers; all whom are keeping the wheels greased and society moving albeit at a slower pace.

We have noticed a considerable increase in spring visitors to the Village as they are getting out of the city while social distancing, and some have submitted applications for projects. Since last newsletter, we have approved one deck covering and porch addition project, and two storage shed projects.

Would also like to remind everyone that even a new painting project of your home is required to be approved by the ACC. The Building Standards & Practices document states guidelines for colors (should blend with nature). No permit is necessary, but the ACC has the authority to approve.

For those who are thinking of starting a construction project, or those in the throes of one and unsure what the next step is, see below:

The Guidelines/Procedures for Building Applications are as follow:

Property owner submits proposed building plan application to LBVCA ACC, whom reviews these plans for <u>Covenant Compliance</u>, and then approves/denies applications using Building Standards & Practices as a guide. Building Project Checklist is completed by property owner, and appropriate fees and performance deposits are collected.

Benton County Development (Building Safety Division) will only issue appropriate Building Permits **after** receiving application approval from LBVCA ACC.

After project is completed, ACC follows up and reviews/approves/denies for <u>Covenant Compliance</u>. When the CO (Certificate Of Occupancy) is issued by a Benton County Building Inspector, and final approval is then obtained from the ACC, the property owner may then apply to the ACC for a refund of their Performance Deposit.

The Architectural Control Committee meets the first Monday of every month, however we are currently monitoring the COVID-19 situation and will soon make a decision as to the next scheduled June 1<sup>st</sup>, meeting.
