On the call for any other new business Manyhides inquires if Bloodymuzzle and other members wish to get back to doing the "postal targets" on a regular basis for integration into the normal format of club shoots. The response was yes and even though Ron used to provide targets there is always one in the "Poke" with mailing instructions and if you have an opportunity to copy your own that would be great. Maybe Darrell could get a supply we could keep in some kind of container on the hill. Manyhides also proposed an idea of having a Top Gun" competition that would be a minimal cost of \$10.00 per year or approx a \$1.00 per month and to keep it simple just on club shoots- the highest scored normal 50 point target for the year.

The entry would be up front or would be the same rate no matter when a person enters the contest. A trophy or award of some kind would be given at the Christmas party with a yet to be devised method of breaking ties if necessary, your thoughts welcome but soon. And one final submission by the scribe was to appeal to club members, not the club to join together in picking a program such as "Wounded Warriors" with low admin costs and take on an obligation in this case \$19.00 per month or \$228.00 per year for a sponsorship of the program.

Manyhides indicates he would make up any shortfall after all have had a chance to volunteer their support. There are many veterans programs and even some for active duty personnel where volunteers put together "care packages" of personal items and magazines and sometimes scarves and body armor for those "over there". I would not consider the programs as permanent to us and they could be rotated and all participation is purely voluntary.

#### MORE BUSINESS FROM THE SKINNERS

Meeting called to order By Capt. Gilkey, called for treasurers report and a detailed report was provided indicating current balances against anything remaining outstanding. Always a pleasure to see someone prepared and well versed on the subject at hand, thanks Mule.

In "old business " Capt. moved quickly into the bylaw amendment before us related to- emergency procurement opportunities, or in simple english, when someone happens upon what seems to be availability of an item in short supply, an item well under market price and an opportunity to replenish inventory at considerable savings on expendable supplies the authority to purchase up to a set limit without club approval. All means to communicate to the Capt, and/or Treasurer for confirmation should still be undertaken when possible. The motion passed on concept with the limit set at \$750.00 however the exact language to the new amendment was not given nor is my description the way it may appear in subsequent documents.

Recently, there has been a considerable effort put in mainly by Scott to identify sources for supply through normal channels as well as arrange for transportation at a savings whenever possible. He believes he has found a source for flint and if so the club will make a considerable investment to get a supply back for members at a reasonable rate. The quoted price will bring a bag of ten to a minimum of \$15.00 but may be slightly higher as we need to discuss if we want to up the charge for supply to allow for replenishment with ever increasing prices in play.

Also, I think a big vote of gratitude is in order for the Mule to go over and above in his capacity to see to this for all of us, Thank you sooooo much. We then moved to Squirrel Shoot 2014 issues. Darrell on targets is on track for both SS 2014 and 2014 Territorials as well. a work party will need to be scheduled to collate target packs and color code when the time comes. He also mentions he likely will not be here for

SS 2014 so we will thank him for his efforts in advance of the date. Splinter will handle hawk handle and plaques again but say's this may be the last year, again thanks.

From the last meeting I believe Bloodymuzzle and Gutshot are looking into medallions and tokens for SS2014.

Report by both webmaster and scribe indicate a desire for member submission of photo's and articles to be included in newsletter and don't
