Once a week, on Wednesday nights, RecoveryWerks! is providing an education class on the Phases of Substance Use Disorder (SUD) for our young people and a similar class for our parents but with the added education of 'How SUD Effects the Family'.

In providing this education last Wednesday I was reminded of how strong denial can be in both the substance user and in their family members. Some people see alcohol and drug use among teenagers with a sense of high disappointment and some see it with the sense of mere experimentation or simply a phase kids go through. Wherever you find yourself in this thinking, please know that for approximately 10% of our teens the use of alcohol and drugs is a disease – a primary, chronic, progressive and deadly disease. This is where the denial comes in to play, where users and family members alike don't understand that the substance is now running their lives. While going through the different symptoms of this illness with our group one of the greatest deterrents for people believing they need help and then seeking help is downplaying or minimizing the severity of underage drinking, vaping or drug use, along with justifications and making excuses.

In the words of Chris Herren, the NBA basketball player turned Recovery Provider and Advocate, I would ask "what is going on in your life that you wanted to change how you felt today?" And get them in to see a professional substance use counselor. There is no shame in having this disease. The shame is in not seeking help.
