Supervisor May called the board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at the town hall located at 3529 Rt. 20A, Warsaw, New York.

Supervisor May opened with the Pledge of Allegiance; all were thanked for attending the meeting. [There were no questions or comments from the audience.]

Supervisor May introduced and welcomed Ms. Abbey Griffith, Maureen Gardner and Mr. David DiMatteo. Supervisor May thanked Ms. Gardner for all of the work that she does for the Town residents and the Town's children. There was discussion on how the Town and Camp Wyomoco should work together, that all of the Town residents could enjoy the camp. The Town has donated money to the camp and would like to have some days and times that would be available for the Town residents. Ms. Griffith stated that they have 4-H kids, a large shooting group and sportsman group, horse trails and barns for horses, a pond, waterfront, fishing, Kayaking and much more. It is truly a family environment great for parents and kids to enjoy.

There was discussion regarding what kind of improvements are needed, and that camp was at one time on a regular maintenance schedule program. They are working on repairing the cabin roofs, they have replaced ½ of roofs, they are painting. They have replaced stone work in front and replaced windows. The Horse barn roof was replaced (as it had never been replaced). A new pavilion was built and new hot water heater installed. The goal is to get all of the cabins up to snuff and in better shape. The trails are well maintained, mud is an issue at times, and working on paving the driveway. There are 12 cabins in overnight shape (a total of 16 cabins) there is a house with 3 bathrooms and 4 bedrooms and a facility for horses.

There was discussion about Abbey and Maureen brain storming about what to do and how to utilize the camp for the Town also. The two will meet and brain storm about possibilities and such activities.

Supervisor May stated the discussion regarding the information regarding cannabis vs hemp products. The Town Board will charge the planning board with rules for selling, marking and business for this market. The Board will hold a public hearing on November 4, 2021 at 745pm to discussing opting out of the cannabis law. Town Clerk Report:

Our Town website visits for September 2021 was 984, total of 9966 for the year. The Towns total revenue for the month of September 2021 was \$1,533.00: \$35.00 for Zoning, \$306.00 for dogs, \$25.00 for late fees, registrar - \$10.00 and DEC, \$1,157.00. We had 22 dog renewals and 3 new dog licenses. To the general fund, \$228.80, Dogs were \$95.00, \$25.00 for late fees, Registrar -\$10.00, DEC-\$63.80, and \$35.00 for Zoning. We disbursed \$170.00 to Wyoming County, \$41.00 to Ag and Markets for dogs, DEC-\$1,093.20. Copies of all reports were viewed by the Town Board.

Supervisor May requested a motion to approve the 2021 Highway Funds bills: Abstract #10 Vouchers #146 through #167, totaling \$42,291.79.
