

43. History and Significance Originally, this land belonged to George C. and Emeline Huntington, but in 1861, 10.4 acres were sold to his son, Erastus, then age 22, for \$5.00. Educated at Oberline College, Erastus was a clerk in the general store (The Lodge- ERI-1562) in 1854 until 1866 when he purchased a half interest in the business. The same year he was appointed Postmaster of Kelleys Island, a post which he held until 1884. In 1871 Erastus purchased full interest in The Lodge and his business flourished. By 1876 he had outgrown this residence and built his grand house (ERI-1707) on the south shore.

Erastus sold this house to Robert R. Moysey in 1879. Robert Moysey was born in Lincolnshire, England, in 1826, and emigrated to Mansfield, Ohio in 1852. He was a leader in grape, peach, apple, quince, and small fruit growing on the island. Robert Moysey was one of the founders and Treasurer of the Sweet Valley Wine Co. (ERI-1618). His second wife, Susan Snyder, of Pennsylvania, was the island music teacher. Sometime after 1896, the KIL&T Co. owned this residence for laborers in its west quarry; it was house #82. Around 1940, the house was rented to Mathew Kennedy. Born in 1879 to parents of Irish and English birth, Matt was a cooper in the KIL&T Co. north quarry, and lived in a rented house on Huntington Lane before living in this residence after the quarry shut down.
