The members were reminded of the Mill Creek Distribution Water Users meeting at 10:00 A.M. in the Council Chambers. Gary stated that Jim Walker had discussed with him the fact that when Dick Nunn had been cut off, then cut the locks and we had to send Byrns up, Nunn should have to pay the wages and mileage. Dale stated he felt the motion would be made not to hire a Creek Commissioner again. Dale stated that the Commissioner has been a help to the District in controlling use on the mesa, and has done other things to help out the District. D. L. stated these points should be brought up at the meeting, since the District basically pays his salary.

With regard to the water table, Pierson reported he had contacted Birdwell with the USGS about the use of a D. L. said that the weir need not be measuring device. permanent. Dale observed the flow and feels there is no appreciable loss. When there is

outflow, he feels the lake rise is about the same as the inflow. Pierson checked for any wells being measured in Castle Valley, and they only have one. Mark Page does not regularly measure any wells in Castle Valley. D. L. mentioned that perhaps John Groo could do some interviewing and getting statements from residents of Castle Valley. The Blanchard report is now due on June 1st, and advance reports indicate the water source is 6 miles due east, between the mesas.

The irrigation system is pressured up, with not much use. The golf course was going to test last week, but McPhilomey has not called him. Dale had asked to be present when their line is tested.
