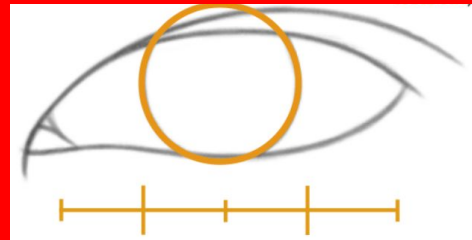
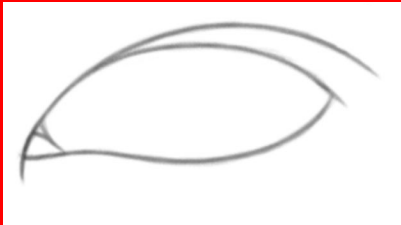
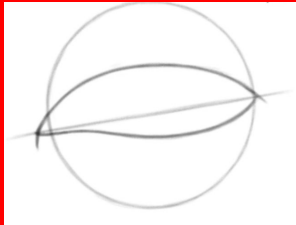
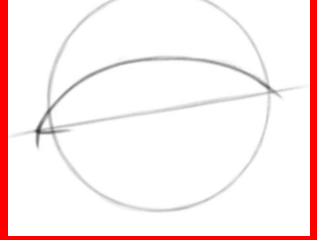
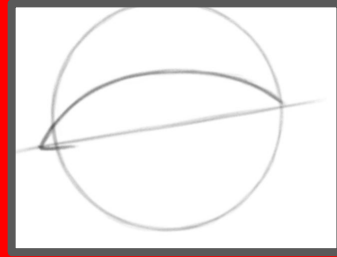
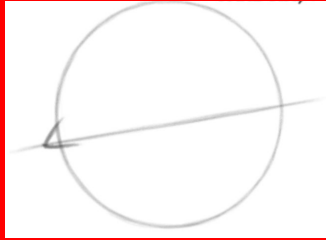
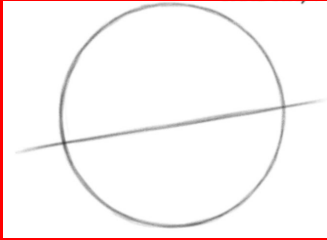
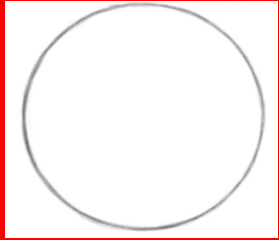


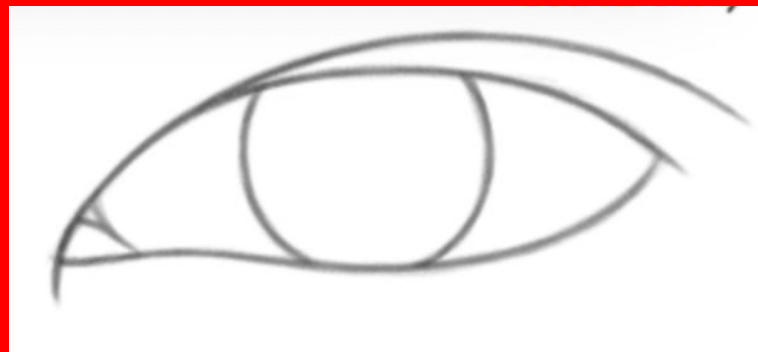
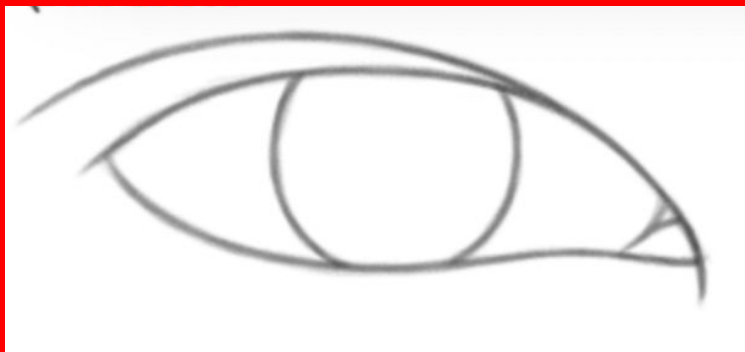
Start by **lightly** tracing out the position of the eyes:

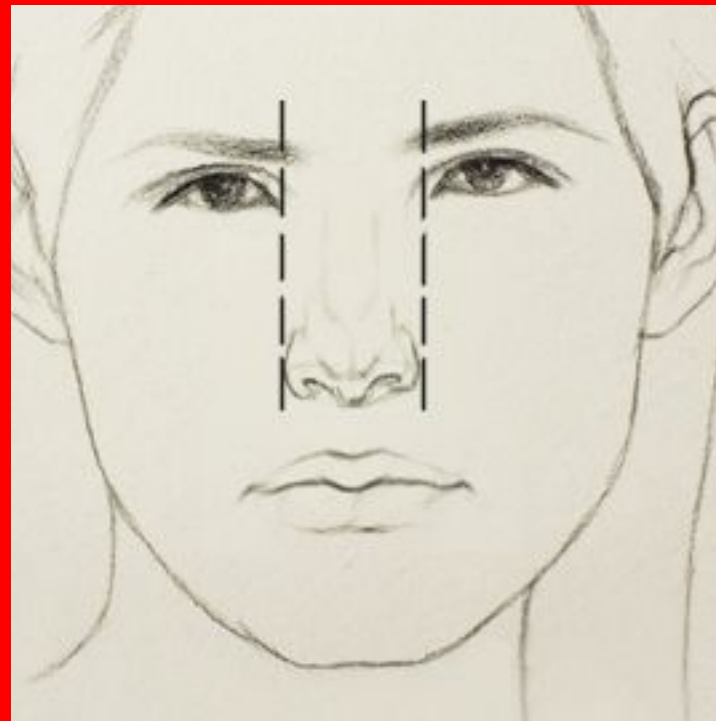
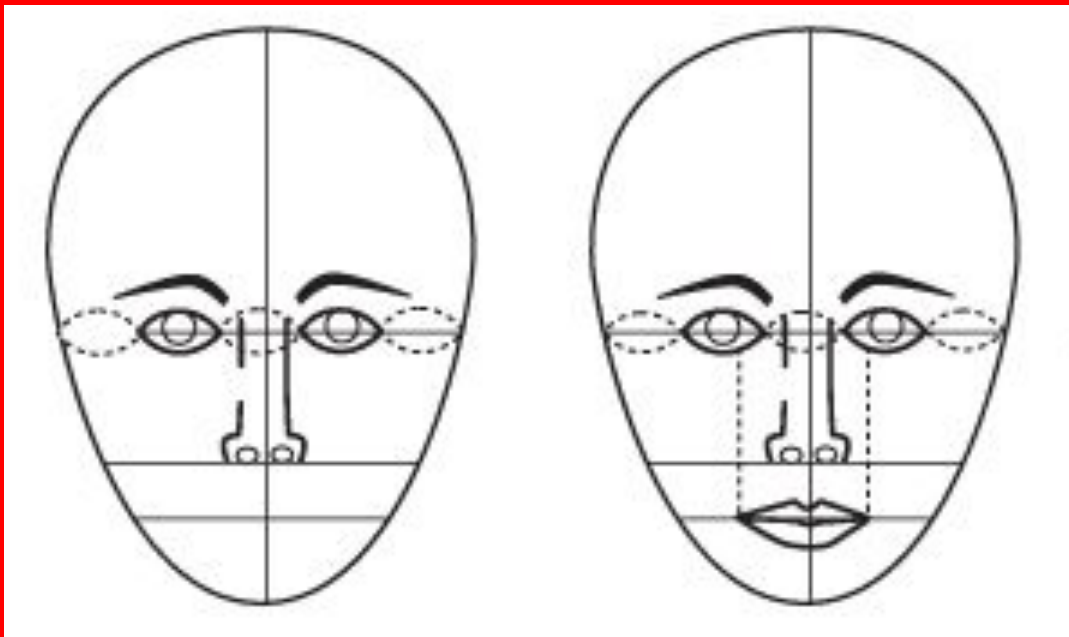
Remember, always start with SHAPES: a circle
AND line: a diagonal line:

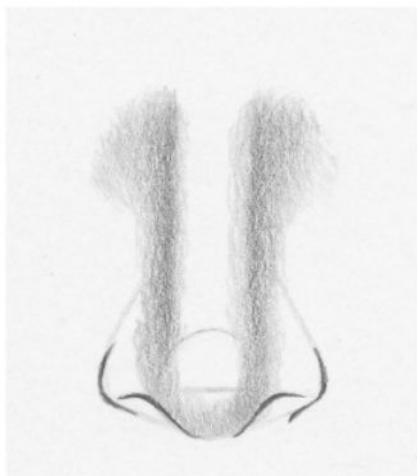
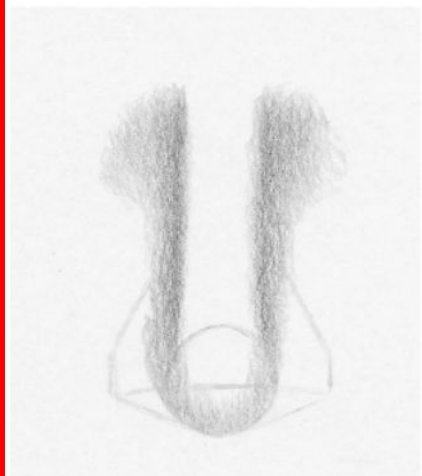
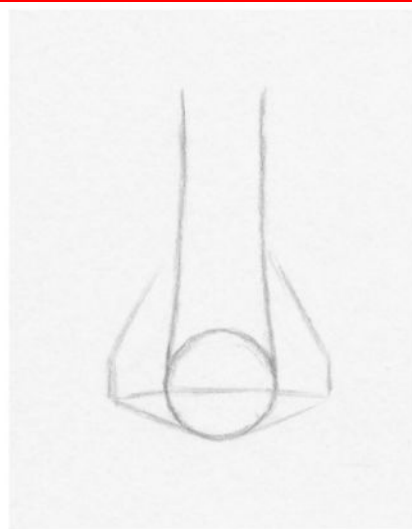
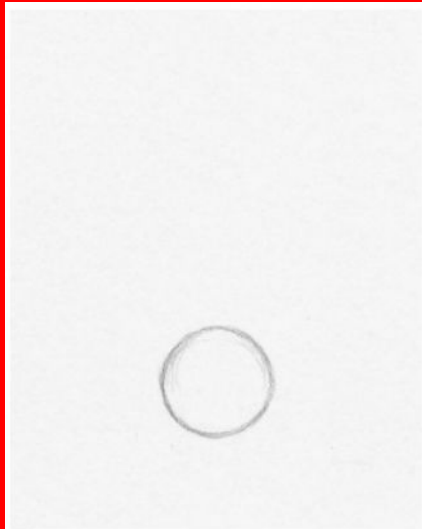


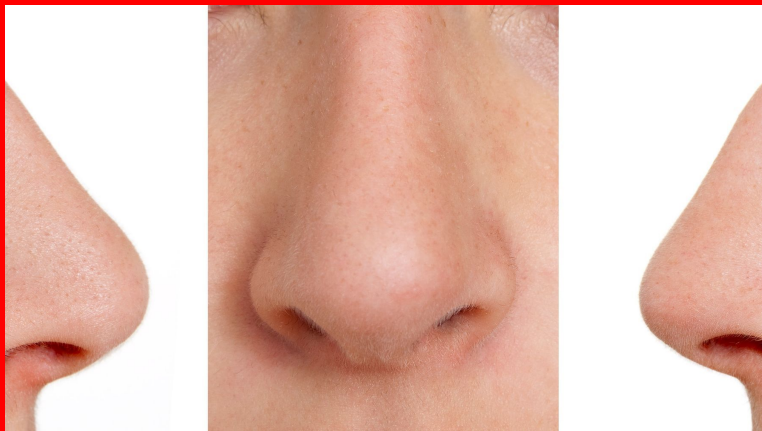




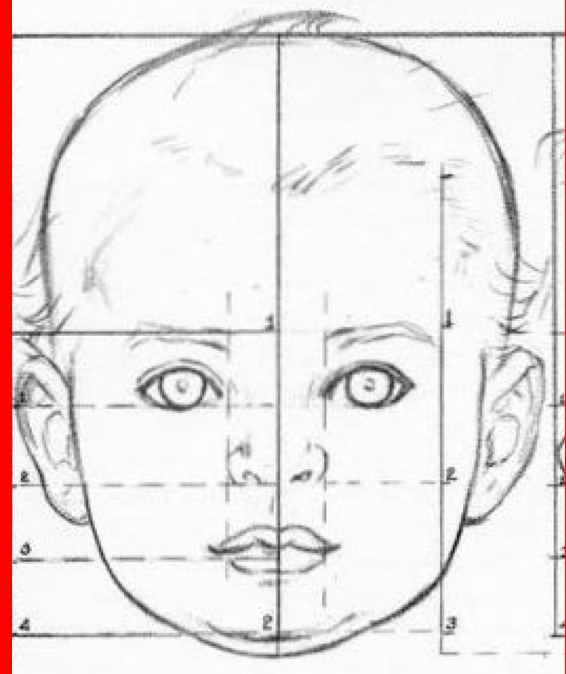
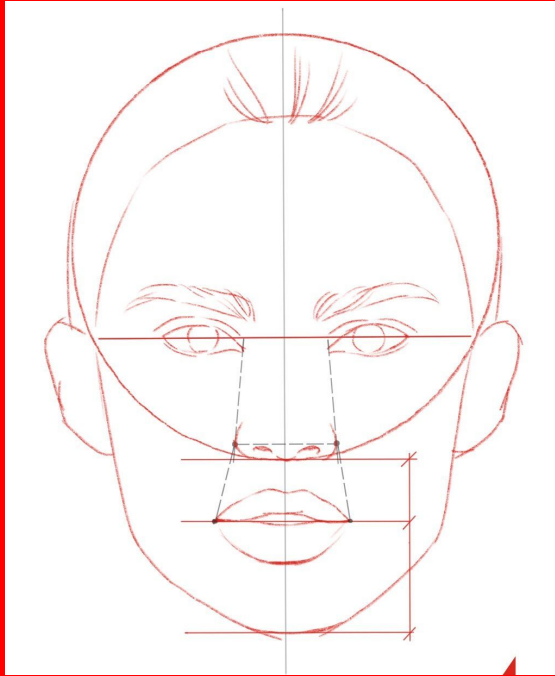
Now, let's add a nose:
