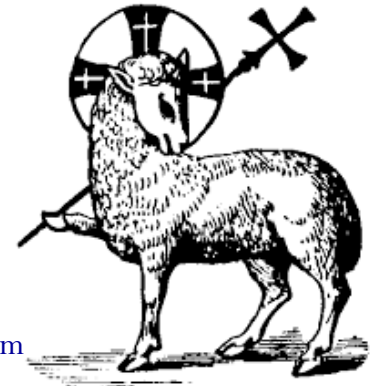

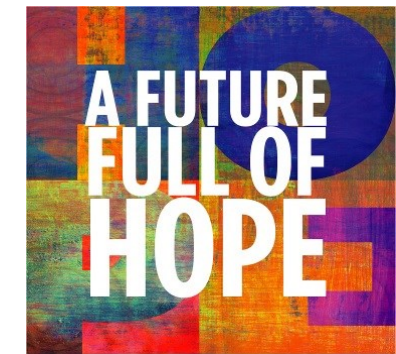
**THANKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT**

communities. Our goal for this year is \$58,408. We have currently received \$48,315.97. Any deficiency must ultimately be paid from parish resources.

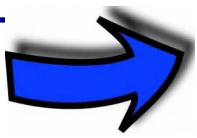


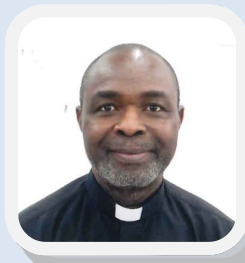
**MARYKNOLL VISIT**

**THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH**

**THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH**

**1210** Christ instituted the sacraments of the new law. There

are seven: Baptism, Confirmation (or Chrismation), the Eucharist, Penance, the Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony. The seven sacraments touch all the stages and all the important moments of Christian life: they give birth and increase, healing and mission to the Christian's life of faith. There is thus a certain resemblance between the stages of natural life and the stages of the spiritual life.

**1211** Following this analogy, the *first case* are the three sacraments of Christian initiation; the *second*, the sacraments of healing; and the *third*, the sacraments at the service of communion and the mission of the faithful. This order, while not the only one possible, does allow one to see that the sacraments form an organic whole in which each particular sacrament has its own vital place. In this organic whole, the Eucharist occupies a unique place as the "Sacrament of sacraments": "all the other sacraments are ordered to it as to their end."

**CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATOLICA**

**LOS SIETE SACRAMENTOS DE LA IGLESIA**

**1210** Los sacramentos de la Nueva Ley fueron instituidos por Cristo y son siete, a saber, Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucaristía, Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, Orden sacerdotal y Matrimonio. Los siete sacramentos corresponden a todas las etapas y todos los momentos importantes de la vida del cristiano: dan nacimiento y crecimiento, curación y misión a la vida de fe de los cristianos. Hay aquí una cierta semejanza entre las etapas de la vida natural y las etapas de la vida espiritual (cf. Santo Tomás de Aquino, Summa theologiae 3, q. 65, a.1, c).

**1211** Siguiendo esta analogía en primer lugar los tres sacramentos de la iniciación cristiana (capítulo primero), luego los sacramentos de la curación (capítulo segundo), finalmente, los sacramentos que están al servicio de la comunión y misión de los fieles (capítulo tercero).

Ciertamente este orden no es el único posible, pero permite ver que los sacramentos forman un organismo en el cual cada sacramento particular tiene su lugar vital. En este organismo, la Eucaristía ocupa un lugar único, en cuanto "sacramento de los sacramentos": "todos los otros sacramentos están ordenados a éste como a su fin" (Santo Tomás de Aquino, Summa theologiae 3, q. 65, a. 3, c).

**PERMANENT MASS SCHEDULE CHANGES TO COME**

As has been announced **STARTING WITH THE WEEKEND OF AUGUST 31/SEPTEMBER 1**, a new Mass time schedule will be adopted for the Parish.

This NEW schedule will be as follows:

- The 9:00 am Saturday morning Spanish Mass will be cancelled;
- **A regular daily Mass will be celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:00 am. This Mass will not fulfill your Sunday obligation however;**
- The 5:30 pm Saturday Vigil Mass will remain the same and in English;
- The 8:15 am Sunday morning Mass will be moved to 8:30 am and will be prayed in Spanish;
- The 11:00 am Sunday morning Mass will remain the same and prayed in English.

These changes have been under serious and prayerful consideration for a significant period of time by Father Peter and the Parish Pastoral Council as to how best to accommodate the changing needs of the Parish. They are being undertaken for the following reasons:

- Changes in parish demographics have necessitated a review of our Parish's needs.
- The Bishop notified us that the 9:00 am Saturday Spanish Mass is not in conformance with the time requirements for a valid Sunday Mass which must occur late Saturday afternoon and so had to be removed from the schedule.
- The work schedules for many parishioners strongly favors an early morning Sunday Mass time. The 8:15 am Sunday Mass was the most sensible option for our Spanish Mass as a result and was moved to 8:30 am to accommodate work schedules yet maintain an early Mass on Sundays for everyone.
- The 11:00 am Mass which will remain at the same time and in English will provide for time in between the two Sunday Masses for our regular Religious Education Programs and after Mass activities and will be prayed in English as is currently the case.
- Dwindling numbers of parishioners/Mass attendants suggest that an increased number of Masses is not warranted at this time.
- After careful and prayerful discernment these changes are believed to best represent the current needs of our Parish and will be adopted.
