3. Many verses encourage God's people to give thanks.
List at least two that are most edifying to you.
4. We give thanks to the LORD, but Scripture uses many other names for God. Find at least two other names in English and explain what they tell us about the LORD.
5. Find at least two more references (not part of the "drumbeat") that speak of God's goodness.
6. The Psalmist highlights the goodness of God.
How might God's goodness inform our understanding of His other attributes? Choose an attribute and explain.
7. Utilizing a concordance, find at least three biblical instances of God's *hesed* (Strong's #H2617) that are of particular blessing to you.
8. The New Testament was written in Greek, not Hebrew, but we can still learn much from it about the steadfast love of God. Using only New Testament references, list two particular things we can know about God's love.
