

X-Mas

This abbreviation for Christmas is of Greek origin. The word for Christ in Greek is Xristos. X is also the letter Chi which is the first letter of Christ's name in the Greek alphabet. During the 16th century, Europeans began using the first initial of Christ's name, "X" in place of the word Christ in Christmas as a shorthand form of the word. Although the early Christians understood that X stood for Christ's name, later Christians who did not understand the Greek language mistook "Xmas" as a sign of disrespect.

Most people when asked why they like their "Little-Bird" will tell you that the car reminded them of when they were in high school, their parents owned it, they like the "time" area, or simply because they like the car. These were the answers you would have heard at the Concourse d' Elegance.

The Concourse d' Elegance Hilton Head, South Carolina, November 3-6, 2005 had focused partly on the 50th Anniversary of the Thunderbirds. In attendance displaying their "Little-Birds" were seven (7) clubs from around the United States. As it was "Club Day", Saturday, November 5th, 2005, at 7:15 A.M., the cars began arriving and directed to their designated area on the Honey Horn Plantation field.
