Kids' Summer Camp Information:

Dear students and parents,

The Thrivent Choice committee of Trinity Lutheran Church would like to help kids attend summer camp at Camp Okoboji.

Camp Okoboji has a long history with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Previous campers would be anxious to tell you how much they love it and can't wait for next year. Activities during the camps include bible study, music, crafts and sports. More info is available at www.campokoboji.org

The church will provide \$100 per child in financial aid. We will also provide \$150 per child for week long camps and \$100 per child for shorter camps from our Thrivent Choice dollars. Additional financial aid may be available from lowa District West for those with financial hardships. Talk to pastor if needed.

Our mission is to give every kid a chance to go to camp and every effort will be made to accommodate each family's financial needs.

Registering for camp and transportation to and from will be the responsibility of the parents.

Camp dates and costs are as follows:

Kids' Kamp is a weekend camp for kids in Kindergarten-2nd grade with a parent or other adult family member. Cost is \$140 for adult and \$90 for kid. Kids' Kamp is May 31-June 2.

2 options for Cub Week! Cub Week is for kids who have completed 3rd-5th grade.

June 23-27 (5 day option-pick up on Thursday) \$310 July 14-20 \$375

July 7-13 Junior High Week is for kids who have completed 6th-8th grade. \$375

July 21-27 Youth Week is for kids who have completed 8th-12th grade. \$375

Let your Light Shine

Scripture: "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father Who is in Heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

Are you waiting for something that seems to be too long in coming? Maybe it's a job promotion or a raise. Maybe it's just employment of any kind! It's difficult to wait. People in Jesus' day were waiting for a Messiah. It seemed to many that His coming was long overdue. Our waiting is over! The Light has come into the world!

Simeon was one who knew that the time had fully come, and, in the temple, he saw the Christ Child Whose parents brought him there to fulfill what the Law required of them (Luke 2:27). Simeon knew Jesus was the light. He proclaimed, "For my eyes have seen Your salvation…a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to Your people Israel" (Luke 2:30, 32).

Unfortunately, not all who were waiting for the Messiah recognized Him when He came. In John 1:4-5 we read, "In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." Though those who are in the darkness misunderstand the Light, yet He continues to shine, and, as He shines, He dispels darkness.

And He calls upon us to shine also. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, described a lamp that is put on a stand so that it lights up the whole house. Then He said, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father Who is in Heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

The only way to dispel darkness is to fill it with light. As Great Commission stewards, it is our joyous task to be reflections of Christ's light. We are always to be prepared "to make a defense to anyone who asks [us] for a reason for the hope that is in [us]; yet do it with gentleness and respect" (1 Peter 3:15). In this way we proclaim that the waiting is over! Jesus, the Light, has come into the world!

Dear Lord, thank You for bringing me out of darkness into Your light. Help me to reflect Your light to those around me. Amen.

From Pastor's Desk...

^{ESV} **1 Thessalonians 5:17** pray without ceasing, ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you

Prayer is a gift that God gives to His children. God has commanded us to pray and promised to hear us. ESV Matthew 7:7 "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. This gift enables us to communicate with Him our needs and wants, but, also, to offer our thanks and praise for His continuous giving. One of the gifts we give one another is the gift of praying.

Christians should have an intentional and regular prayer life. The Bible outlines three times a day to pray: evening (because that is when day begins), morning, and noon.

ESV **Psalm 55:17** Evening and morning and at noon I utter my complaint and moan, and he hears my voice.

You probably pray in the morning, at bed time, and before meals. But what do you pray during those times? We are aided by prayers in catechism, hymnal, and Portals of Prayer- those are fantastic resources and Christians should use them. I also find keeping a list of people to pray for is an excellent way to make sure you are being faithful to your promise: "I'll pray for you." Human nature, being what it is, needs reminders, encouragements, and even set times and places to pray to keep us focused. These are good things, so don't feel bad if you find yourself needing to set aside a specific time to pray. If you've fallen out of the practice, there's always opportunity to start up again. Don't feel bad, just make it happen.

With this in mind, we are going to begin offering prayers for each family in the congregation during weekly services. We will divide up the congregation list so that each family is prayed for on a regular basis. This does two things: it commends to God the people of His Church, and it helps us stay connected to the people, our family, in the congregation. Please add your church family to your regular prayers.

ESV **Psalm 19:14** Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer.
