Operation Christmas Child

Yes, it's that time again! We fill shoeboxes with prizes and send them to the poorest children in over 100 countries (including the US). As a mission, Operation Christmas Child hits a home run. It feeds their bodies with the hygiene supplies we send; it feeds their hearts with the toys and school supplies (as with hygiene, most likely their first ever); and it feeds their souls with their exposure to Jesus. There are millions of poor children around the world. This mission focuses on the poorest of the poor.

Your first step is to decide what shoeboxes to use: plastic ones like the ones sold in the dollar store; cardboard boxes (any size); or the professional ones made by "Samaritan's Purse" already decorated and sold for about \$3.00 at Hobby Lobby. There will also be shoeboxes available in the old preschool/storage room in the hallway by the upper kitchen. Take whatever you need for Operation Christmas Child. Finished boxes can be left in the office or at the Operation Christmas Child table in the narthex through Sunday, Nov. 11th.

Food Bank News


- The "urgent need" for October is canned meat products. Ex. Ravioli or Spaghetti O's with meat.
