Overview Despite surging firearm ownership in the U.S., the number of active gunsmiths is shrinking. Aging tradesmen are retiring without successors, and fewer young people are entering the field, leading to a shortage of skilled professionals.

Gunsmiths handle everything from basic cleaning to complex customization and design.

While modular firearms allow users to do more themselves, many tasks still require expert knowledge.

With over 500 million civilian-owned guns and consistent monthly sales exceeding 1 million units, demand for maintenance and repair is high.

Personal Insight Even DIY-savvy gun owners often outsource tasks due to time, skill gaps, or safety concerns—highlighting the ongoing need for professional gunsmiths.

Spotlight on SDI The Sonoran Desert Institute (SDI) is addressing the skills gap by offering online, industry-focused programs in firearms technology. Their evolving curriculum helps preserve traditional gunsmithing while integrating modern techniques.

Conclusion Gunsmiths remain essential in 2025. With high demand and low supply, it's a promising trade for newcomers—and SDI offers a solid entry point.



On June 30, just before midnight, a man allegedly entered a home in Elkhorn City, Ky, and threated the homeowner and family. The intruder reportedly had a gun, which the homeowner was able to take from him, but the assailant then allegedly pulled another gun and attempted to fire a shot. Fortunately, that gun did not discharge. The homeowner grabbed his own firearm and shot the home invader in the leg. Reports say the wounded man attempted to fire the malfunctioning gun again, this time pointing it at a women in the residence, but it again did not fire. The homeowner forced the man out of the residence and called authorities. Troopers found the suspect in an alley nearby bot noted that he still had a gun and appeared intoxicated. They finally took the man into custody after a standoff that lasted several hours. He faces numerous charges including alcohol intoxication, resisting arrest, attempted murder, and terroristic threatening. 27 States Ask Suprem Court to Review Magazine Capacity Limits

A coalition of mostly Republicanled states, spearheaded by Montana Attorney General Austin Knudsen, filed a 32-page amicus brief urging the U.S. Supreme Court to overturn Washington State's ban on highcapacity magazines. The case, Gator's Custom Guns v. State of Washington, challenges the law previously upheld by the Washington Supreme Court in May.

Knudsen stated, "The Supreme Court needs to step in to uphold Americans' right to keep and bear arms," arguing that Washington's restrictions infringe on the rights of lawabiding citizens to possess magazines commonly used for self-defense.

States joining the brief include: Idaho, Alabama, Alaska, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, West Virginia, Wyoming, and the Arizona Legislature.

In addition to the state-led effort, three major gun rights organizations—the National Association for Gun Rights, the National Rifle Association (NRA), and the National Shooting Sports Foundation (NSSF)—filed separate briefs supporting the challenge.

Americans Bought at Least 1 Million Guns Again Last Month

Firearm sales in the U.S. rebounded in August 2025, breaking the 1 million mark after dipping below it in July for the first time in nearly six years. According to the National Shooting Sports Foundation (NSSF), which analyzed FBI background check data, there were approximately 1,091,342 adjusted checks for likely gun sales last month. While this reflects a 9.9% drop compared to August 2024, it's still a notable increase from July's 978,731.

NSSF's Mark Oliva emphasized that these figures reflect more than just statistics—they represent Americans investing in their personal safety and exercising their Second Amendment rights.

With at least 28 states offering Brady exemptions, and growing interest in DIY firearm builds, the true scope of gun ownership continues to expand beyond what federal data captures.
