From Pastor Bill's Study

Greetings to all,

In Charlottesville, the protest against the removal of a statute leads to a counter-protest and the death of three people. In Barcelona Spain, a driver again drove into a crowd and killed people who had only moments before had just been everyday people until they became a target for an individual with a plan of destruction.

In both of these cases, the overriding issue is one of a spiritual nature where hate has over ruled the thoughts of the individual and common sense and the consequences were over ridden and evil prevailed.

Trustees' Report.....

We're almost to the point where we won't have progress on the renovation projects to share anymore because they will be completed! With a work group scheduled to thoroughly clean the new kitchen in late August, the kitchen will be ready for its required inspection. That should conclude the renovations projects we've committed to in the church.

Although it's not related to the renovations, you may have noticed a larger refrigerator in the Elm Street Lounge. Because of the large size of the refrigerator which came from the parsonage, we decided to put it in the Elm Street Lounge and move the smaller refrigerator over to the Parish House.

In the Parish House, the new doors (front, stairway, office and restroom) have been installed and painted. Now that the flooring has been shored up from underneath, the finishing touches are being completed in what will be Pastor Bill's office. The previously mentioned work team will also be focusing their efforts on moving furniture around and eliminating the temporary eyesore of storing office furniture on the Parish House porch. Other finishing touches include, repairing or replacing some of the windows which don't open or close well, and the installation of blinds for the windows.

Our sincere thanks to office staff for their patience while they've had to work with, and around, the construction crews over several months and to the entire congregation for their patience through the various renovation projects.

Lay Leader's Report

In Pastor Bill's absence, I conducted the full Traditional worship service at Bethany on Sunday, August 6 and Dave Gehrum of Watsontown UMC delivered the sermon at that evening's Contemporary service. The same format will apply on August 20, and for the same reason. Additionally, the Traditional sermons on those dates have been, and will continue to be, structured in accordance with the series on the Book of Romans that Pastor Bill I has scheduled for every Sunday morning throughout the summer.

Vacation Bible School 2017, which ran from July 17 through July 21, was a rousing success, largely due to the distinct advantages of our partnership with Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church. Because of ongoing changes in the local Lutheran system, It's not yet clear (and won't be for some time to come) whether we will be able to mount such an effort in the same way again next year, but those of us who participated in conducting it this year are certainly hoping that we can.

On July 26 I paid a visit to some good friends who are on the staff at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg. One of the highlights was that I was invited to participate in one of the Seminary's Lay School classes (which was a privilege I also experienced in 2016). The LTSG Lay School is offered at about the same time every year, and always consists of five consecutive daily sessions of several hours duration. The themes of the courses vary from year to year, and for 2017 the focus was on what the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) calls their "Book of Faith" Initiative. This is a long term program that seeks to increase Biblical literacy and fluency for the sake of the world. By it, they're committed to encouraging their members, congregations and synods to dig deeper into the Bible – the "Book of Faith." On the day I was there, I got engaged in a long and somewhat intricate conversation with a group of four ELCA lay people about Scriptural relationships to the state of the modern church, such that my Methodist perspective and their Lutheran understandings met to form an interesting exchange of ideas that none of us had really anticipated. The Book of Faith effort has its place, certainly, and when I came home, I started to probe the ELCA initiative more deeply. As I continue to examine it, I hope to be able to find ways to apply some of its methods here.

Ad Board Report

Pastor McNeal opened the August 15 Finance Committee / Ad Board meeting by involving the participants in a special time of ceremonial devotion, based on Jesus' demonstration of humble servanthood as described in the Gospel of John. This was very effective in centering us all in preparation for the evening's work, and we hope to make such a valuable preconvention observation a permanent fixture.

The latest financial reporting shows that we're making great progress in improving the ways in which we manage the church books, track our cash flows, and tend to our payments. An interim internal audit will take place as soon as the system is pronounced fully readjusted and ready.

The church-owned laptop computer that was formerly used by the Music Director (position now open) has been suggested as a dedicated device for financial record-keeping. That avenue will be pursued, but with regard to preserving the former files on a separate drive so as not to sacrifice any of the information presently built up on it.. Note, however, that while the use of the laptop is viewed as a satisfactory near-term measure that utilizes our current equipment to the fullest, that move does not obviate the future possibility of getting a new desktop for finances if circumstances warrant.

The Board unanimously approved of opening Bethany to the August 22 funeral of Fred Kurtz, a former member of the church and a long-time Milton fire chief. The service will be conducted by Rev. Arlene Beechert of Muncy UMC.

Pastor Bill is arranging for our church to host a session of Safe Sanctuaries training. The date stands to be Sunday, October 15. Confirmation and further details will follow.

The 2017 Church Conference will be held on October 22 at St. Andrew's UMC Milton. As one of the preparations for that session, our Nominations team will soon confer with the Pastor about committee staffing and changes.






