Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

4th Sunday Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:1-12

"Fanfare for the Common Man" is a splendid, uplifting musical score by American composer Aaron Copland. He wrote it in 1942, inspired by a speech by US Vice President Henry Wallace. Wallace used the phrase "Century of the Common Man" to celebrate the power and persistence of the American farmer, soldier and factory worker. These everyday citizens knew that American strength lies in a regular handworker's **willingness to sacrifice** for a better life – for the freedoms of self-expression (one's labor-talent, one's religion, one's free opinion, one's movements). The common US spirit was one of service shown through the embrace of its civic duties: "1)duty to **produce** to the limit. 2)duty to **transport** as rapidly as possible to the field of battle 3)duty to **struggle** with all that is in us. 4)duty to **build a peace**—just, charitable and enduring." That's not only noble action but also that's '**next-door**' in America! The US worker, soldier and farmer do exemplify hard work and humility, and should always be commended.

When I hear the Beatitudes of Jesus (Sermon on the Mount), I hear Jesus celebrate what later He will call 'salt of the earth' (Matt 5:13-next Sunday's gospel). They are the ones who both sustain and season the world! The **meek** and **merciful**, the **poor**, **peacemaking** and **pure** ones that are inevitably **persecuted** (which brings on the **mourning**-since all struggle includes sadness). And what drives these best of souls among us, but their **hunger** for something more. Jesus commends them: the Kingdom of God is theirs! They uphold the whole structure. Or as the OT book of Sirach tells us, "*All these are skilled with their hands, each one an expert at his own work.... Without them no city could be lived in, and wherever they stay, they do not go hungry.... Yet they maintain the fabric of the world*" (Sirach 38:31-32, 34). These are the people you want showing up when you are down, the ones you want beside you in the trenches, and the ones to walk into your life when things are falling apart! As Sirach 38 said, "they maintain the structure/order of the world". There is a quote from an old movie called "Fight Club" (a kind of voluntary, private MMA sports club that also acted as a social commentary), which was provoked after its members got persecuted by an political investigation by a grandstanding police commissioner bragging about shutting it down. In a confrontational scene, they confront him with a deal he can't refuse telling him to leave them alone, "*Look, the people you are after are the people you depend on: we cook your meals, we haul your trash, connect your calls, we drive your ambulances, we guard you while you sleep....*" It is those unrecognized workers that keep the lights on for us, the stores open and the busses running. Back during the Covid days, there was a needed renaissance of respect for what we called 'frontline workers', where people actually tipped and thanked cashiers, cabbies and cooks out of appreciation for their undervalued work (how far we've come). I hear Jesus celebrating these 'salt of the earth' humble, hard-workers in our society, through His teaching of the Beatitudes.

For the Kingdom of God, to be displayed in our world, We need 'Indeed'! Calling all Christians! We could use a rediscovery of the heavenly value of the blessed qualities of mercy meekness and mourning, poverty, peacemaking, purity, and even persecution (that builds character!) And along with all of these virtues, we need a 'hungering' for something more (how did the music group Switchfoot sing it, "We were meant to live for so much more.....more than this world's got to offer"- to fill the God-gap in each of us!) Of course, Jesus is that fulfillment we seek. He embodies that presence of God's Kingdom, by bringing it down into the basic human yearnings for better, more fuller life, that we all share and experience everyday. Christ shines in the basic needs of our brothers/sisters being fulfilled and our simple duties humbly taken up each day. God calls us to keep focused on our 'next right thing to do', and that by doing it with heart, we are doing our part in bringing about His Kingdom on earth (as it is in heaven). This is St Therese' Little Way of God's Service, but it is also following the command of Jesus Himself who further taught us that whatever we do to the least of our brother and sister, we do to Him (Matt 25:40, 45).
