

Viviana Cumplido has served as Principal Flute of The Phoenix Symphony since 2006, and the Colorado Music Festival in Boulder since 2010. Prior to her appointment in Phoenix, Viviana served as principal flute of the Tucson Symphony for three seasons.

She has an active teaching and chamber music career and is a member of the Urban Nocturnes chamber group, as well as the IRIS Chamber Orchestra in Memphis, Tennessee. She has also performed with the Oregon Symphony, Britt Festival Orchestra, New World Symphony, National

Orchestral Institute, National Repertory Orchestra, and the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria. As concerto soloist, Viviana has appeared with the orchestras of Phoenix, Tucson and the Colorado Music Festival. She has also been a guest artist for Jim Walker's Beyond The Flute Masterclass at the Colburn School in Los Angeles and competed in the 2006 Carl Nielsen International Flute Competition in Odense, Denmark and was the only American semi-finalist.

Viviana is proud of her track record of educational outreach, especially to underserved communities using music as a means to promote greater achievement in students as a Young Musician's Foundation mentor in Los Angeles and with the Opening Minds through the Arts program in Tucson. She is an active participant in several of The Phoenix Symphony's outreach programs, regularly performing at hospitals, dementia care facilities and homeless shelters.



#### Gail Novak, Pianist

Gail Novak, a resident of Mesa, Arizona, is in demand as a collaborative artist in the United States and abroad. Gail performs often at Arizona State University and in the Phoenix area with university faculty, students, and guest artists. She has served as an official accompanist for the International Clarinet Association ClarinetFest© in Tempe, Columbus, Ostend, Tokyo, Norman, North Ridge, Lincoln and the International Trumpet Guild, International Double Reed Conferences and the National Flute Conventions, the national trumpet competition in Fairfax, Virginia, as well as being the featured collaborator at the Oklahoma Clarinet Symposium for many years in Norman, Oklahoma.

Moving from California to New Jersey to New York, Fran Hawthorne has spent more than three decades writing award-winning nonfiction, including eight books, mainly about consumer activism and business social responsibility. Her book *Ethical Chic: The Inside Story of the Companies We Think We Love* was named one of the best books of 2012 by *Library Journal*. She also was a staff editor or regular contributor to *The New York Times*, *Business Week* and *Fortune*. Fran's first love since age four has always been fiction, and in 2018 her debut novel, *The Heirs*, was published. She is now at work on two new novels.

The Men of Brandeis will tour the Phoenix Herpetological Sanctuary. The Sanctuary is located just south of Dynamite Road on North 78<sup>th</sup> St.

in Scottsdale. It was founded in 2001.

There were plenty of organizations to rescue many species of animals, from dogs and cats to birds. However, there was no such facility or refuge for unwanted or rescued reptiles. Reptile owners had no outlet to relinquish ownership if needed, nor was there a resource to acquire accurate, reliable information on the care and husbandry of reptiles as pets. In addition, native and non-native species were being destroyed by state facilities and other animal rescue agencies, due solely to lack of knowledge regarding care and housing of these amazing creatures – native and exotic. In response, the Phoenix Herpetological Society (PHS) was launched.

Today PHS is a fully operational, 2½-acre rescue and rehabilitation center with an onsite reptile clinic and research center located in northern Scottsdale. A dedicated team of over 20 individuals volunteers regularly to maintain the sanctuary and care for the hundreds of reptiles housed at the facility. PHS works with state and federal wildlife officials and law enforcement to care for and house unwanted or seized reptiles from across the U.S.
