### **Emeryville Sport Fishing**

On September 17th, Denise and William Davis along with Ralph and Becky Fregoso joined the charter sponsored by Dan Hernandez. Early Saturday morning, we boarded The New Huck Finn. With clear skies and a light breeze, the ocean was calm enough to head out for the open waters. The sunrise through the Golden Gate Bridge was amazing. Catching salmon was our goal. Salmon Mooching was the technique. The captain trolled slowly with all of the anglers' setup as followed; swivel, 2 lb. ball wt, swivel, a 4 ft. leader with a 5/0 barbless hook. A lively anchovy was added last. Only a few salmon were landed that morning, although our excitement rose with every nibble. After several location changes, the bite was gone. We did see some red tide in the area. (Tip- salmon are scared away when the grasses are left on the line. Check your line often and remove all weeds and grass.) It was early afternoon when Captain Jay decided to move to a rockfish area. GREAT MOVE! We lightened the tackle and the fishing got HOT!! Everyone took a limit of rockfish that day.

September 18th, day 2, found us boarding the Salmon Queen with Captain Shim. Once again we were hoping for salmon limits. The deck hands set us up with 8 oz. wt. for the salmon mooching. The strength of the current affected the weight that we used. The day started slowly with very few nibbles. Eventually 3 salmon were caught by some guys on the other side of the boat. Every time we changed locations Captain Shim would announce the depth range which we were targeting. We lowered our weight to the water level put the reel on free-spool with our thumb on the spool and pull the line out (about one foot at a time) to the desired depth. Then we put the drag in gear. Things got interesting when the thresher shark started hitting. At times there were two or three hook ups at once. The energetic captain would jump into the action in order to limit the tangled lines. Denise joined the action when something big began dragging her line almost completely around the boat. She continued to keep the tension on the barbless hook and finally landed a large thresher. A total of 9 threshers were caught on the Salmon Queen. It's too bad the sharks don't count for the jack pots. A little later Denise had another hook-up. This fish fought differently. William was pleased and proud of Denise as she landed a beautiful halibut! It was the Jack- Pot for the day!!!

William, Denise, Ralph, and I had a great day. A day filled with nibbles and laughter.

Could life get better than this? YES!! We finished the day with a nice Birthday/dinner party for Ralph at the Fisherman's Wharf in San Francisco. Dan, William, Denise, Ralph, a few new fishing friends and I enjoyed a VERY PLEASANT EVENING.





**Fishing on the Pacific Dawn,  
September 17,18 - 1 1/2 day trip

After a quick turn around from the previous trip we boarded the Dawn about 8:00 pm. The last trip did not do very well with only a few tuna after a long boat ride. So we were not very optimistic about having a good trip. We stopped for bait, Sardines and a few small Mackerel. The see was calm as we headed south from Fisherman's Landing in San Diego. Captain Pat Cavanaugh said we were headed south for 130 miles and to get some sleep, we were going for a long boat ride and it would be around 11:00 before we would get there.

We put the trolling rigs out around 10:30 am and got our first strike around 11.00 am. A nice bite of Bluefin Tuna from 15 to 18 lbs. After a short ride Pat spotted a large kelp patty, we took in the trolling lines and drifted by the kelp and all hell broke lose. Dorado were everywhere with Yellowfin Tuna mixed in. After the feeding frenzy was over we went back to the same kelp patty and it started all over again. There were so many Dorado in the water, all you had to do was put your bait in the water and you got bit. We stopped a couple more times for a wide open Yellowfin Tuna bite. By 5:00 pm we were done fishing and headed for home. Fellow member Larry Natsume won the Jackpot with a nice 25 lb Yellowfin. We ended up with 49 Yellowfin Tuna, 43 Bluefin Tuna, and limits of Dorado for everyone on board. One of the best trips I can remember
