


## Summer 2005 Trojan Football Activities

# Jenks' Brewer throws two TDs - Named Game MVP Oil Bowl: Oklahoma hammers Texas stars

WICHITA FALLS, Texas -- Jenks' Andrew Brewer threw two touchdown passes Saturday night to lead Oklahoma to a 38-7 win over Texas in the 68th Oil Bowl between high school all-stars from the two states. Brewer, who was named the game's MVP, threw for 79 yards on 8-of-14 passing. He had 22 yards rushing. It was the biggest loss ever in the series for Texas, which was shut down by a stout Oklahoma defense that limited Southlake Carroll's Chase Daniel to just 31 yards on 2-of-9 passing. He also threw an interception, fumbled twice and was sacked twice. Tulsa Union's Michael Cowan was named the game's defensive MVP, recording a sack, a fumble recovery and three quarterback hurries.

## Giving Back to Football Jenk's Scott Kempenich & Coweta's Rick Bryan University of Oklahoma Alumni

Many players and parents did not realize they were seeing a part of Sooner football history during the 2005 Team Camp. Jenk's, Scott Kempenich, Co-Offensive Line Coach and Coweta's, Rick Bryan, coaching their positions during the 2005 Team Camp. Both Kempenich and Bryan played football at the University of Oklahoma. Kempenich graduated from Wagoner High School and Bryan from Coweta High School. While there may be almost 20 years between their playing time at OU, both coaches played an important role in the history of Sooner football. Rick Bryan was a 1982 and 1983 All American and Academic All American. Rick and brother Steve Bryan are both storied players at OU and legends in Coweta football history. Kempenich, also an Academic All American, helped bring OU back to national prominence playing offensive line on the 2000 National Championship team and is a great representative of Wagoner football.
