The First Sunday of Advent, December 3, will mark the beginning of the Liturgical Year throughout the world. It will also designate the commencement of the 150th Anniversary of the founding of the Diocese of Scranton. The territory that comprises our Diocese was part of the

Archdiocese of Philadelphia until March 3, 1868, when Pope Pius X created the Diocese of Scranton.

Our Diocese has a rich and noteworthy history that we will recognize, beginning with a Pontifical Mass on Sunday, December 3, at 12:15 p.m. in the Cathedral of Saint Peter, and continuing through most of next year with liturgical celebrations and numerous annually occurring and specially focused events.



Diocesan Annual Appeal at 61% of Goal; Text-to-Give Giving Option Expanded

The **2017 Diocesan Annual Appeal: Walking Together in the Light of Christ**, has raised more than \$3 million in gifts and pledges, bringing the campaign to 61% of the \$5 million goal.

More than 17,000 parishioners have pledged a gift to the Appeal so far in response to a gift request letter that was mailed to past donors in September and through the In-Pew Commitment Weekend collection that was recently held in parishes throughout the Diocese. An expanded Text-to-Give giving option for the Annual Appeal is being presented in parishes during the month of November.

"We have improved the Text-to-Give program for this year's Diocesan Annual Appeal based on wonderful input we received from parish representatives at our Annual Appeal Regional Committee meetings in August and September," said Jim Bebla, Diocesan Secretary for Development.

This year there are two Text-to-Give giving options using cell phones. The first option is a simple one-step process that gives parishioners the opportunity to give \$10 by texting the word LIGHT and their parish name and city to 50555. This option does not require the donor to submit contact or credit card information. The donation will appear on the donor's next cell phone bill. If donors prefer to make a gift of a different amount or a pledge over several months, they can

text the word APPEAL to 50555 and the donor will be sent directly to the Annual Appeal online giving site where they can make a credit card gift.

Bishop Bambera to Ordain 11 Permanent Deacons

Bishop Joseph C. Bambera will preside as ordaining prelate and principal celebrant on Saturday, November 25, for the ordination of 11 men to the Permanent Diaconate for service as permanent deacons in the Diocese of Scranton. The newly ordained deacons will join the ranks of clergy who minister to the faithful in parishes and other settings throughout the Diocese.

During the Mass of Ordination, scheduled for 10 a.m. in the Cathedral of Saint Peter, Bishop Bambera will ordain the following men to serve permanently in the Order of Deacon:

Carl S. Albright, Paul J. Cooper, Herbert W. Cruikshank, Andrew A. Fazio Sr., Maxime E. Francois, Michael M. Golubiewski, Leonard Jinselli Jr., Ronald D. Maida, John P. Musyt, James M. Rebarchick and Robert J. Warnock.

These men have completed a five-year formation program and will become members of the threefold ordained ministry that consists of bishops, priests and deacons.

The deacon's service has three aspects: word, worship and charity. He can perform certain ministerial functions such as administering baptism; serving as the deacon at the Mass, including proclaiming the Gospel, preaching the homily and distributing Holy Communion; bringing viaticum to the sick; presiding at wake services, funeral liturgies and burial rites; and with permission by the pastor, may celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony.

He ministers to the needs of families, single parents, students, the aged and infirmed, the imprisoned, and those who suffer from poverty or addictions.

Principal concelebrants for the diaconate ordination Mass will be Bishop Emeritus James C. Timlin and Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus John M. Dougherty. Also concelebrating the Mass with Bishop Bambera will be Monsignor Thomas Muldowney, V.G., Vicar General of the Diocese; Father Jeffrey Walsh, V.E., Episcopal Vicar for Clergy; Monsignor David Bohr, Diocesan Secretary for Clergy Formation and Director of the Permanent Diaconate Formation Program; Father Donald Williams, Diocesan Director of Vocations and Seminarians; and other priests of the Diocese, including the pastors and spiritual directors of the ordinandi

All are invited to participate in this special liturgy. CTV: Catholic Television will broadcast the Mass.

Education Funding Bill Needs to be Signed into Law

As part of Pennsylvania 2017-18 state budget, lawmakers approved a \$10 million increase for the expansion of the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program. That is great news; however, Governor Wolf has yet to sign the bill into law. In fact, he has threatened to veto the legislation that would provide for the increase.

The Pennsylvania Catholic Conference has sent a letter to the governor urging him to sign the education funding bill into law, noting that this bill would allow for more scholarships for students to attend the school that is best for them. The EITC program has enabled many students in our Diocese to obtain a Catholic education.

At the end of the Gospel according to Matthew, Jesus tells his disciples to "go...and make disciples of all the nations" (28:19). But what practices follow from what we preach? After the 2016 election, a moral theologian provocatively remarked that "Catholics too often fail to connect how they think politically with what they profess to believe religiously" (Stephen J. Pope, "Not the Time for Reconciliation"). In this workshop, Bernard G. Prusak will explore the formation of conscience, the virtues - the excellences of character - internal to Christian morality and the principles and implications of Catholic social teaching.

Dr. Prusak is Associate Professor of Philosophy and Director of the McGowan Center for Ethics and Social Responsibility at King's College, Wilkes-Barre. He writes frequently for *Commonweal* and has written two books: *Parental Obligations* and *Bioethics and Catholic Moral Philosophy in Practice and Theory.*
