MYSTERIES

Jesus told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like someone who planted good seed in his field. While people were sleeping, an enemy came and planted weeds among the wheat and went away. When the stalks sprouted and bore grain, then the weeds also appeared.

The servants of the landowner came and said to him, "Master, didn't you plant good seed in your field? Then how is it that it has weeds?"

"An enemy has done this," he answered. (Matthew 13:24-28 CEB)

One of my favorite genres of books is murder mysteries. Recently, I discovered an author that I had not read. S. A. Cosby is a new author, who has only written four books. The first book I read from him was actually his latest book. I never was able to figure out who the murderer was before it was revealed in the book. This well-written mystery kept me engaged while I tried to solve "who done it."

If we are honest, the Bible is a library of mysteries involving real people awaiting our investigation. Interpreting the Bible calls for shrewd detective work. The greatest mysteries in the Bible are the four gospels. We may not know the name of each of the four evangelists, but we do know that each of them wrote their gospel to a particular group of people for a particular purpose. As biblical detectives, we put their themes and theology under a magnifying glass and ask the question, "In what context would these themes and theology be crucial communication for their community?"

The mystery of the parable of the weeds and the wheat is found only in Matthew's gospel. Why did the author of this gospel feel that a story about weeds and wheat was important to his community? Most likely, Matthew told this parable to address some situation regarding two groups of people in his congregation.

Most scholars agree that Matthew was writing to a mixed Jewish and Gentile congregation; neither group wanted to accept the other. Each viewed the other as weeds, themselves as wheat. This conflict between the two groups was serious and destructive to his congregation.

The parable is an attempt by Matthew to answer the question, "How do you motivate people who enthusiastically claim to follow Jesus but refuse to follow his ethical teachings?"

Perhaps it is his attempt to answer the question, "How are two groups to coexist productively and peacefully when each refuses to forgive the other, but instead excuses their own behavior while judging that of others?"

Some weeds need to be plucked up and the sooner the better. The parable does not mean we avoid negative experiences in life, but instead we are to seek out harsh sounds, funky smells, unpleasant situations and difficult people. An unjust ruler needs to be opposed. A bad habit that hurts ourselves and others needs healing.

If something smells in the fridge, we clean out the whole fridge to find the culprit: the moldy lemon in the back of the produce drawer or the wilted lettuce we forgot about.

This parable is primarily about relationships between people. It is about not judging and not assuming that we are wheat and others are weeds. When we judge others and dismiss their contributions and value, we become weeds among the community's wheat.

If we claim to follow Jesus, we must follow his lead and treat everyone we encounter with compassion and forgiveness.

- Pastor and Linda Arreguin were in Cincinnati with the Washington UCC mission group and unable to attend the meeting.
- Rummage Sale was a huge success this year. However, the coordinators would like to take next year off, so we will be looking for other volunteers to head this Church event.
- Getting ready for the August 4 Poet Voice Concert. Volunteers will be needed to check people in, greeters, and others and a signup sheet will be created.
- We will be staffing the gates at the Henry County Fair on August 15 from 7 a.m. through 9 p.m. so it takes a large number of volunteers.
 Look for sign-up sheet. We will be paid \$1,200 for our work. The money will be put toward planned capital projects.

- Discussed door mats for the entry doors and the work that will be required in those areas. Decision was made to order the better quality mat with "St. John's UCC" imprinted.
- After further investigation, the suggestion to install a commercial dishwasher has been withdrawn.
- Work continues to remove concrete from the basketball court. Ben plans to grind off the protruding bolts from the basketball hoop in the next few days.
- Personnel team recommendations were approved:
 - O Accepted Dawn Fry's resignation as custodian effective 6/30. Norma Nagel will fill the position temporarily to allow Consistory to accept applications from the congregation for the position through July 15. Consistory approved hiring John Hahn, who has served as custodian in the past. He will be hired, assuming there are no other applicants. They will meet to discuss if there are additional applicants.

- Personnel team recommendations were approved Continued:
 - All staff will sign Employment Agreements on hire and at the beginning of each calendar year.
 - Staff reviews will be done in September, using selfevaluations and follow-up interviews.
 - Approved adding Martin Luther King Day as a paid holiday for Pastor Jeff and the Administrative Assistant.
 - 2 ongoing congregational members were added to Personnel Team to provide for better continuity as Consistory members change each year. Joe Long and Marianna Doolittle have accepted these appointments.
 - Approved cell phone reimbursement of \$30/month for the Administrative Assistant, recognizing that the personal cell phone is used both in the office and after-hours for church business.
 - Personnel team will meet with Carl Dettmer to complete his 90-day review. His pay will be increased by \$1/hour retroactive to April 8.
- Working to recruit a small group to consider options for celebrating 165th Anniversary for St. John's in 2025. Greg Nelson and Bob Rettig will be Consistory members on the team, assisting Eric Shank, Consistory Chair.
- Authorized transfer of funds from Major Maintenance to Operating Fund to pay for the automatic door repair.
- Ministerial CD matured in mid-July. Decided to reinvest at Edward Jones for 4.75% for 2 years. Investments must be in increments of \$1,000 and the interest earned will be deposited into a money market account.
- Deacons recommend and Consistory approved changing from Terminex to Buckeye Exterminating for pest control.
- Technology Team has replaced the failed speaker. They also recommend purchase of a screen for the east side of the sanctuary, about half-way back. Consistory approved use of restricted Technology funds for these replacements.

 Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility provides intensive residential treatment to meet the needs of young people and their families. The goal is to get them home within the shortest possible time.
- Secure Care Recommended for youth with high-security needs that are a danger to themselves or others. These safe spaces are in compliance with Juvenile Justice Delinquency Protection Act and Indiana's Youth Law Team; working together to find a path forward.
- Open Treatment Addressing emotional and behavioral issues manageable in a less restrictive environment. Transitional Living is available so older youth can focus on education, job skills, and community living skills.

The August mission is a familiar face. Crossroad continues to hold a special space in the heart of St. John's UCC. We hope that you continue to open-up your hearts and wallets and help Crossroad become a conduit between children in need and a world that doesn't always feel kind.

Thank you for your continued generosity today and throughout the year.


