

A familiar sight along Crow Valley Road just across from the entrance to Coffelt Farm, the rehabilitated apple barn, now owned by William Perry, was originally built by William B. Hambly in 1890, and was one of two identical barns built across the road from each other. Lorraine McConaghy to speak on WA Territory during Civil War era

As noted above, in lieu of our regularly scheduled History Matinee, in the month of August the Orcas Museum will sponsor public historian Lorraine McConaghy to speak on Friday night August 24th, from 7-**9pm**, in the Lundeen Room of the **Orcas Senior** Center. Her chosen topic will be: Washington Territory during the Antebellum and Civil War Eras. As the nation commemorated the 150th anniversary of the American Civil War, Ms. McConaghy curated an exhibit called Blue vs. Gray: Civil War in the **Pacific Northwest** which revealed the influences of that conflict as a 'war of issues' in which the political leaders and residents of Washington Territory fully participated. As she is a member of the **Humanities** Washington speakers bureau, this lecture is provided free of charge.

Antiques Evaluation Fair ~ postponed to September 30th

Originally set for Sunday August 5th, our Antiques Evaluation Fair has been rescheduled for **Sunday September 30th** to serve more of the local residents in the "slightly off busy" season. Certified Appraiser Bette Bell will head up a team of professionals whose affiliations range from Sotheby's of London to the American Quilter's Society, and she herself specializes in porcelain, glass, silver and textiles. As we progress with this project, it will make it increasingly possible for anyone to come in and get an immediate digital readout on any family name or subject related to Orcas history, with information on exactly where to find printed materials, photographs, objects, oral histories, diaries and even videos. Anyone with good typing and computer skills can do this job, and we will always need help in this department. We are also still in need of 'readers' to simply read through some of our non-indexed books on Orcas history and make hand-written notations, so that they can then be digitized by someone else. Front Desk Greeter

During this summer season we have been open only five days a week, due to volunteer shortage. Please help us stay open on our normal season schedule by offering to put in some hours. Training is provided of course!

Events

From our monthly History Matinees to special gatherings, lectures & season parties We always need help setting up and cleaning up afterward, as well as sound or video operation, donations of finger food and beverages or other logistical help such as offering to provide accommodations for a visiting speaker.

Crow Valley School Museum

Be a greeter at our one-room schoolhouse museum! Located near the north trailhead of Turtleback Mountain, this museum is set up to showcase all the first schools in San Juan County. Indexing & Digitization
