

Marks of Faith

Hebrew 13:1-6



Let brotherly love continue. ² Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so *doing* some have unwittingly entertained angels. ³ Remember the prisoners as if chained with them—those who are mistreated—since you yourselves are in the body also.

⁴ Marriage *is* honorable among all, and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge.

⁵ Let your conduct *be* without covetousness; *be* content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, “*I will never leave you nor forsake you.*”⁶ So we may boldly say:

*“The LORD is my helper;
I will not fear.
What can man do to me?”*

2. How should we treat strangers?

3. What is the meaning of the word angel? How might we “entertain” them?

4. How does verse 3 indicate we should we treat those who are suffering for their faith?

5. What does God command about marriage, intimacy and sexual relationships in verse 4?

6. How should we then treat our spouse?

7. Read Hebrews 13 verses 5-6. Compare it to Luke 12:15 and 1 Timothy 6:6-10. How should we handle material possessions?
