January Duo Piano Masterclass

Dear MTACLB Members

CALL FOR MASTERCLASS PARTICIPANTS

In keeping with this year's loose theme of collaboration, our January piano master class will be a unique event and special opportunity for your students. We are excited to have Mark Uranker and Althea Waites of CSULB's own Orpheus Duo giving a clinic on duo piano playing on Sunday, January 10th at CSULB! Their biographies and information about the Orpheus Duo are attached.

We are looking for four duos (8 total students), each preparing one piece or movement, for this event.

This is a fantastic opportunity for your late intermediate / early advanced students to gain experience collaborating with another like-leveled musician before they get to college, and to explore a new type of music they might not otherwise get the opportunity to perform alongside their solo repertoire.

Q: What is the intended age/level for this event?

A: Preference will be given to high school students performing more advanced repertoire (approximate CM levels 6+). College/adult students will also be considered after high school students have taken available spots.

Q: Is this class intended for two pianos or one piano, four hands?

A: Preference will be given to students preparing two-piano music. Available space will then be filled by one-piano four hands participants.

Q: My studio only has one piano, but I have two students I know would be perfect for this opportunity – how can I prepare students for this event?

A: There are two options: 1) bring in a keyboard to your studio alongside your piano, or 2) book FREE/NO CHARGE TO YOU! time at 2nd VP Tasha Locke's home studio – equipped with a small grand and an upright – any day except Thursdays or Sundays.

Deadline for participant sign-ups is December 1.

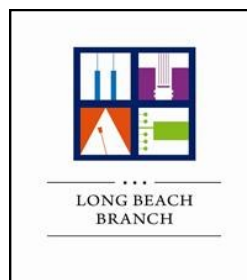
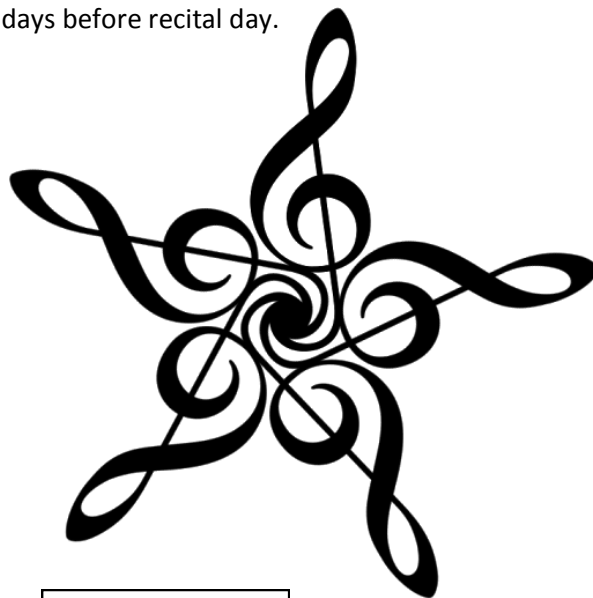


