

**ORDINANCE NO. 83-3**

**ORDINANCE REGULATING FIRES WITHIN CORPORATE LIMITS**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHAPIN, MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS:**

**SECTION 1:** That no person shall, in any of the streets, lanes, avenues or alleys of said Village, or upon any property owned by the said Village, make or kindle any fire without first having obtained permission from the President of the Board of Trustees of said Village or some police officer of said Village.

**SECTION 2:** That between the hours of nine o'clock (9:00 P.M.) and six o'clock (6:00 A.M.) of each day, no person shall make, kindle or maintain any fire within the corporate limits of the Village of Chapin, Morgan County, Illinois, except for the purpose of heating a residence or place of business, or unless permission is first obtained from the President of the Board of Trustees of said Village or some police officer of said Village. Any person making, kindling or maintaining a fire shall be in constant attendance at said fire.

**SECTION 3:** That no person shall make or kindle any fires within the corporate limits of the Village of Chapin, Morgan County, Illinois, under either Section 1 or Section 2 above unless the resulting fire is contained in a barrel, incinerator or other place of confinement.

**SECTION 4:** That any person or firm violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined not more than \$25.00 for the first offense, \$50.00 for the second such offense; and \$100.00 for any subsequent offense or offenses.

**SECTION 5:** That all Ordinances heretofore passed by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Chapin, County of Morgan and State of Illinois which are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
