## TITLE: APPROVAL FOR L & I FENCE CONSTRUCTION, INC. TO CONSTRUCT THE FENCE FOR THE SUMMIT LAKE SPRINGS INTO ACTION II PROJECT (F24AC00674)

- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has the responsibility for the general welfare of its tribal membership including tribal natural resources; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council is the duly constituted governing body within the Summit Lake Paiute Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has been organized to represent, develop, protect, and advance the views, interest, education, resources, and general welfare of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe membership; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has organized a Natural Resources
  Department to provide technical expertise and services to manage air,
  water, soil, fish, wildlife, and plants within the Summit Lake Paiute
  Reservation and off Reservation areas considered the aboriginal
  homeland of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council supports natural resources management that protects, conserves, and enhances plants and wildlife native to the Summit Lake basin and aboriginal area of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe approved SL 05 2024 to accept the funds from USFWS Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program grant F24AC00674 for the Summit Lake Springs into Action II project to protect upper Tule, Slide, Lakeview and Tollhouse Springs by constructing pipe rail fences to exclude trespass cattle and feral horses; and
- WHEREAS, L & I Fence Construction, Inc. possesses the skills to perform the fence construction and their recent projects at the Reservation include the new fence on the western boundary in 2020, the BTAZ lake fence in 2022, boundary fence maintenance in 2022, and the pipe rail fence at middle and lower Tule Springs for the Summit Lake Springs into Action project in 2023 (SL-16-2023), all to the satisfaction of NRD requirements. In addition, L&I provided a reasonable quote for this project, and can perform the work during spring 2024; and

- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe has been awarded grants (Funds 152 and 1502, A20AV01054 and R20AV00010, respectively) to eradicate or control invasive plant species on the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Resources Department has determined that Progressive Pest Management possesses the skills and equipment to perform the above referenced work and anticipates completing the work per the grants' schedules; and
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Summit Lake Paiute Council hereby authorizes, approves, and consents to contract with Progressive Pest Management to perform invasive plant treatments on the Reservation; and
