



### **Pastor's Reflection**

In the next week we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The doctrine of Mary's Assumption was affirmed as integral to Catholic belief by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Despite this late affirmation the doctrine of Mary's Assumption can be traced back to the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> century. The Eastern Churches also recognize this doctrine, calling it the Dormition of the Mother of God. Our belief in the Assumption means that Mary, at the end of her life, was assumed body and soul into heaven. Whether Mary actually died or fell asleep is not settled, but what is important is that she maintained the integrity of her person, body and soul, as she entered into eternal life. It's important to note that this doctrine isn't just about Mary; it is also about all of us. In the Apostles Creed we affirm that we believe in the resurrection of the body. We expect that at the end of time our souls will be reunited with our glorified bodies. As of now, only Jesus and Mary exist in eternity with glorified bodies, but the resurrection of Jesus and the Assumption of Mary point to our own bodily resurrection. Human beings are not just souls with a bodily shell; we are one in body and soul and until the resurrection of the dead, we are incomplete. Mary's Assumption reminds us that our bodies are important and that salvation is not just for our souls, but for the entirety of our person, a unified whole in body and soul. So, taking care of our bodies is as important as taking care of our souls; we should strive to do both, recognizing that what we do for one we do for the other.

### House Blessing, Explained!

Catholics who move to a new place of residence often wish to have their dwelling blessed, to call the favor and help of God upon all those who live in the house and all those who will enter it.

The Roman Ritual (Book of Blessings) provides two formats for house blessings: one during the Easter or Christmas season (specifically for the Epiphany) and one for Ordinary Time. Those who live in the home must be present for a house to be blessed. A priest, deacon or lay person can administer the blessing, although if a lay person does so they must use the rites accorded to lay ministers in the Roman Ritual.

A house blessing includes Scripture readings, intercessions and a prayer of blessing.


