Island Tak Report for August 21, 2010 Trip

I guess that you will notice that since I am writing this report is that I was one of the fortunate ones to win one of the jackpots. So here it goes.....

The anglers onboard this trip were:

Paul Yazaki (chartermaster), Don Merrill, Brian Peale, Jim Clough, Larry Natsume, Glenn Bummer, Nolan Wong, Xavier Lopez, Gary Gillingham, Alexander Perez, Mike Maurizio (MIA).

It amazes me that all were onboard before 10:00PM when the boat is scheduled to leave at 4:30. I guess everyone is hoping to get some ZZZZZZZ's before we leave. That might have been the case for most of us but I am a light sleeper and there were a few snorers that made the evening a little difficult to doze off. It might have been a blessing that I did not fall into a deep sleep because I have been known to kill a lot sheep with my loud snoring.

Anyway there was a slight breeze while we were in the harbor when we left at 4:30AM and the ride was far from smooth. Last month's trip was very nice and this was the opposite. It took almost three hours to get to Santa Cruz Island to where we would start to fish. Since we stayed on the lee side the conditions were beautiful flat calm water. It was a great relief from the ride out. Our bait was fresh dead squid, anchovies and small to medium size sardines. Steve started us off in the kelpy areas hoping for bass, whitefish, sheepshead, sea bass and sugar bass (kelp rockfish). Only the sugar bass cooperated but only for Don Merrill, his secret was using flourocarbon on his two hook ganion using small thin wire hooks with the mini sardines (3"). Paul, Gary and I with a few others were trying for the bass without any luck, we later tried to imitate Don's rig to put something into the sack. A few of us started to catch some but Don was red hot in the morning ending up with a limit of the tasty critters. He also caught the only sheepshead that later won the "other fish" jackpot that was in the two pound category. There were three calicos caught and I was fortunate enough to catch two of them and one of them took the "bass" jackpot. Paul took out his scale and the batteries were dead so the weight was not certified. I weighed it at home and it was gilled and gutted and after I scaled it. It weighed a solid three pounds. It was a nice fat solid bass plus my other bass made a fine dinner for four of us on Sunday night.

The water was cold and dirty in some areas and you could hear the frustration in Steve's voice. He did spot some sea bass in the kelp and tried his best but they were not hungry. At the last spot we tried before heading in is where we

caught the last two calicos and a few more sugars. All of the calicos on this trip were caught on the medium size 4" sardines whereas on the August trip they were all caught on cut squid. So got figure. We saw a yellowtail chasing a sardine on the surface and Steve eased the boat closer to it but it would not take any of our offerings so we called it a day. Paul was begging to leave for home to end this day of miserable fishing. We ended up with 28 sugars, 3 calicos, one sheepshead, three chuckleheads, and one jacksmelt. There were a few greenback mackeral and some baby spanish mackeral caught too! It was a beautiful day for fishing but the ride going out and coming back in had a lot to be desired. Being a new member this year and this was my second trip with you guys. Even though the fishing was slow it was still a pleasure fishing with all of you. Tackle tip: I was using 12# with a thin wire # 1 live bait hook Model # 295711 by Hayabusa with a 1/8 oz egg sinker and it cuts through the kelp really nice and I never lost a hook with this setup on this trip. Many thanks for the jackpot hat! Good luck to you guys on the AA for the long range trip!!!! Nolan
