

He is currently assigned to the US Marine Corps Detachment at Fort Leonard Wood, MO.


There will be a **congregational dinner** after worship on **July 20**. More details to come.

God's Comforting Word

A New Command

Jesus, speaking to His disciples, said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35).

"A new command." Yet it is an old one. It was Moses, way back in the book of Leviticus, directed by God to speak His commands to His people, who said, "You shall not take vengeance...but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord" (Leviticus 19:18).

Jesus amplified His command, however. We are to love, He said, *"as I have loved you."* How did Christ love us? At the time, the disciples did not know the depth of Christ's love. They hadn't heard the angels announce the birth of their Savior in Bethlehem. They had not yet been to Calvary and couldn't comprehend Jesus' references to His impending death. They had no idea that the Resurrection, Ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost were ahead.

We do have that knowledge. We understand what Jesus is talking about for we know how He loved us. He has loved us enough to leave the glories of Heaven. He has loved us more than earthly power and status and honor. He has loved us more than He loved His own life.

Jesus further said that love for one another would be the mark of members of the Family of God. Just as He gave sight to the blind, made the lame man walk, healed the sick, and preached the Gospel to eager ears, so did His followers. So should we today. With the love of Christ in us, we visit the lonely, provide food for the hungry, and share our financial resources in order that the Word of God might be preached and bring many to salvation. Loving others as Christ has loved us means that we should be willing to lay down our lives for them.

Sinful beings that we are, we are not prone to love others as Christ has loved us. The apostle John tells us how it is possible: *"Beloved,"* he wrote in 1 John 4:7, *"let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God."* We are born of God, and, by His grace, we can carry out His command to love one another through all the opportunities He gives us with all the gifts He gives us.

From Pastor's Desk...

Remembering- Memories often include good and bad experiences. A year ago, June 22, 2024, our community and congregation experienced a catastrophic flood that will likely forever mark our history. Our congregation has been engaged a full year's recovery from the flood. It has cost approximately \$800,000, tremendous amounts of time and talents to get us from destroyed to renewed. This cost doesn't even speak to the emotional weight we all have felt over the past year. It is important that we reflect on what happened, and what, by the grace of God, we experienced and accomplished.

Whether good or bad, memories compel us to reflect, but, hopefully, launch us into the future. Having experienced, suffered, laughed, cried, worried, prayed, hoped, we now are faced with a bad memory that God has turned into a moment of gratitude and an opportunity to move forward by His grace.

In 125 years, Trinity has endured. God is with us now as He was with us during major historical events in our nation: two World Wars, Korea, Vietnam, Desert Storm, and Afghanistan. He was with us through droughts, plagues, and epidemics. He was with us through sicknesses, suffering, and deaths; funerals and weddings.

God's presence with us is not merely a feeling or sentiment. When He is with us, He acts. He acts through His Word. ^{ESV} **Hebrews 4:12** For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. God is present with us "according to His Word (Psalm 119:25).

When God is with us He acts, and it affects us. Jesus, the Word made flesh, says: "abide in my word" (John 8:36). The Word of Jesus is the living presence of Jesus. God's presence in the reading, hearing, preaching, and meditating on Scripture delivers what it says and sustains us in the promises it makes. The Word binds us to Christ and in Christ to one another.

The greatest remembrance is when God acted to give us the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Christ's body and blood in the sacrament are done "in remembrance of Me." God is remembering the sacrifice of His as we participate in the giving and shedding of Christ's body and blood shed for the forgiveness of sins.

Memories, acting, participating, and giving. That's how we will carry on as Trinity Lutheran in the years to come. And, by the way, how do you think we should use this new building?

Dear students and parents,

The Thrivent Choice committee of Trinity Lutheran Church would like to help kids attend summer camp at Camp Okoboji.

Camp Okoboji has a long history with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Previous campers would be anxious to tell you how much they love it and can't wait for next year. Activities during the camps include bible study, music, crafts and sports. More info is available at <u>www.campokoboji.org</u>

The church will provide \$100 per child in financial aid. We will also provide \$200 per child for week long camps and \$150 per child for shorter camps from our Thrivent Choice dollars. Additional financial aid may be available from Iowa District West for those with financial hardships. Talk to pastor if needed.

Our mission is to give every kid a chance to go to camp and every effort will be made to accommodate each family's financial needs.

Registering for camp and transportation to and from will be the responsibility of the parents.

Camp dates and costs are as follows:

Kids' Kamp is a weekend camp for kids in Kindergarten-2nd grade with a parent or other adult family member. Cost is \$145 for adult and \$95 for kid. Kids' Kamp is May 30-June 1.

2 options for Cub Week! Cub Week is for kids who have completed 3rd-5th grade. June 22-26 (5 day option-pick up on Thursday) \$315 July 13-19 \$380

July 6-12 Junior High Week is for kids who have completed 6th-8th grade. \$385

July 20-26 Youth Week is for kids who have completed 8th-12th grade. \$400
