2024 election

CALL FOR MAYORAL NOMINATIONS REGULAR ELECTION

Those wishing to run for Mayor at the regular election of the Town of Marble on April 2, 2024, may pick up a Nomination Petition beginning on January 2, 2024 from the Town Clerk, 970-963-1938. The Mayoral seat up for election is 1 four-year term.

Qualifications: All candidates must be a qualified elector of the Town of Marble, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and must have resided in the Town of Marble for one year immediately prior to the date of the election.

Petions must be returned to the Town Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 22, 2024.

CALL FOR TRUSTEE NOMINATIONS REGULAR ELECTION


Those wishing to run for a Marble Board of Trustee seat at the regular election of the Town of Marble on April 2, 2024, may pick up Nomination Petitons beginning on January 2, 2024 from the Town Clerk, 970-963-1938. There are three Board of Trustees seats (1 four-year term and 2 two-year terms) up for election.

Qualifications: All candidates must be a qualified elector of the Town of Marble, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and must have resided in the Town of Marble for one year immediately prior to the date of the election.

Petitions must be returned to the Town Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 22, 2024.

(MASTER PLAN UPDATE)

We are six months into the process of updating Marble's Master Plan. The committee started rather large with 14 participants and slowly thinned to a dedicated eight. Each month they meet to discuss the focus areas the Town of Marble could give more attention to. Such as preserving history, arts and culture, enforcement, growth, infrastructure, environment, housing, etc. These focus areas will shape the Master Plan, beginning with goals, being the desire of the community in regards to each area. From each goal comes an identifiable objective and way of implementing said objective in a timely manner. The committee is in the middle of this process now. At last week's meeting, the results of the survey were presented with a remarkable amount of feedback. The committee will digest that information as they formulate the goals and objectives. Mark Chain, the facilitator, plans to have a rough plan to present to the community at a public meeting early next year. Thompson Divide

Proposed Thompson Divide Area Withdrawal

Thompson Divide is made up of 225,000 acres of public lands (the orange areas in the map to the left). At our December Board of Trustees meeting, Michael Gorman, a representative of Wilderness Workshop based in Carbondale, asked the Board for their support in the efforts to protect these lands from oil and gas development. The mayor and the three trustees present all agreed to help in the protection of Thompson Divide. First, by writing a comment to the Forest Service to introduce an Administrative Mineral Withdrawl. Second, to write a letter in support to permanently protect the area through the CORE Act.
