

According to the most recent financials:

Available Funds:

We have \$667,254.31 available in our checking and savings account. This is the total amount of money we have in the bank. The Operating Account (Checking Account) Balance is \$318,906.19. The remaining amount (Savings) of \$331,453.83 is earmarked for items like the dam fund, vehicle fund, cash reserves, etc.

Road Loan:

We have received \$77,000.00 in Membership Road Dues YTD. Current Road Loan Balance is \$360,911.49. 2022 Road Loan Payment of \$69,793.88 was made in February.

Misc. Income:

Misc. Income is at \$47,956.83. These are monies that come from non-operational items like dock rental, lodge rental, initiation fees, etc.


Past Dues:

Lake Aeration Problem Statement

- Stagnant Water
 - Low Water Oxygen Content
 - Low Water Depth
 - Algae Blooms



- Mayflies and blind midges live in muck and emerge as adults in swarms coating lights, equipment, boats, homes
- Muck contains high levels of nutrients that feed algae and aquatic weeds. As the muck layer grows, so
 will your problems with these aquatic nuisances. Muck can also be a breeding ground for leeches.
- Reduced Fish Count
 - · Fish need oxygen rich water
 - Oxygen Depletion Leads to Fish Kill

Algae

Algae blooms can occur when there are excessive nutrients in the water. Some algae produce toxins that are harmful to people and animals.







Types of Lake Aeration

Fountains



Pros:

Attractive

Cons:

- Costly to purchase/install
- Costly to run compared to other solutions
- Introduces electrical current into lake
- Not built for continuous use with lower life expectancy than other options

Ram Pumps



Pros:

- Low Cost
- Built for continuous use

Cons:

- Unattractive
- Requires gravity fed water source
- Noisy
- Can lose prime

Lake & Dam

Aeration Systems



Pros:

- Built for continuous use
- Energy efficient: electric, solar, wind
- Quiet operation
- Provides excellent value spend versus results

Cons:

- Medium cost \$500 and up based on size
- Monthly electrical cost estimated at \$7-\$10 per month per acre
- Requires some periodic maintenance

Security

Just a reminder that a sticker or pass is required to enter Elk Lake. All contractors and deliveries are signed in. If times. Please do not allow your dogs you are the property owner and do not to run off your property. have a sicker on your vehicle or are with someone in another vehicle you will be asked to write a pass for the vehicle you are in. This is to let everyone know that the vehicle has been properly checked at the gate.

When you write a pass for a guest please let your guest know that they can NOT have cars follow them in. They can NOT have people meet them at the gate and expect to bring them in unless those people have a pass as well. The guest pass is for one car and whoever is in that car. If additional people are going to show up or drive in they need a pass. Additional cars/people will be turned away if they don't have passes.

When expecting guests please be sure to have a pass filled out and ready for them at the gate. When guests arrive at the gate and there is no pass it can cause a backup/ congestion due to the amount of traffic at the gate. Also if a property is in more than one name please let the guest know what name to ask for. Guests are asking for a pass in one name and it's actually in another name. This can also cause a backup/ congestion when there is a lot of traffic at the gate.

A reminder once again that your dogs must be under your control at all

Tables at the beach are first come first serve. You can not set a bag or anything else on a table then leave and return hours later and expect to use that table.

Remember the speed limit in Elk Lake is 15mph. This is for any type of vehicle driving within Elk Lake.

For health and safety reasons and just plain common decency please DO NOT enter the guard shack if you are Covid positive or even suspect you may be Covid positive. Whether you are wearing a mask or not it doesn't matter. We recently had members enter the guard shack and tell the guard after writing passes that they were Covid positive and were supposed to be guarantined. They then said that it was too nice of a weekend to be guarantined. By entering the guard shack you are intentionally putting the guards at risk for getting sick. That's just not acceptable behavior.

Please tell your quests that their pass must be displayed on their windshield or dash at all times while they are in Elk Lake.



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
