The 83rd Anniversary of Pearl Harbor Attack



At our next meeting, we will have as our guest speaker former US Air Force pilot Joe Bianco. He is a 1980 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy. After graduation and completing pilot training his first assignment was to fly the legendary F-4E Phantom based in Moody AFB in Valdosta GA. Following his initial assignment he was selected as a instructor in the F-4E flying out of Homestead AFB near Miami, FL.. He later transitioned to the F-16 Fighting Falcon at Homestead AFB.

In 1989, he had began a disassociated non-flying tour where he became an Air Liaison Officer (ALO) and Forward Air Controler (FAC) attached to the 82nd Airborne Division out of Ft. Bragg, NC. So yes, he was also trained to jump out of perfectly good airplanes. Joe will be presenting his experiences as an ALO/FAC during Operation Just Cause with the parachute assault into Torrijos-Tocumen Airport during the invasion of Panama seeking the arrest of General Manuel Noriega.

If that wasn't enough excitement, Joe was still with the Army's 82nd Airborne Division in 1990/91 for Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm and deployed and advanced with French Division Daguet, 4th Dragoons and Foreign Legion.

Following his combat deployment, Joe returned to the F-16 Viper flying out of Eielson AFB, AK before separating from active duty.

Joe continued flying in the airlines and retired from UPS in 2022 having flown the Douglas DC-10 with American Airlines, Boeing 747, Airbus A-300.
