2/15/54 - Thunderbird was selected as the name for the new sports car

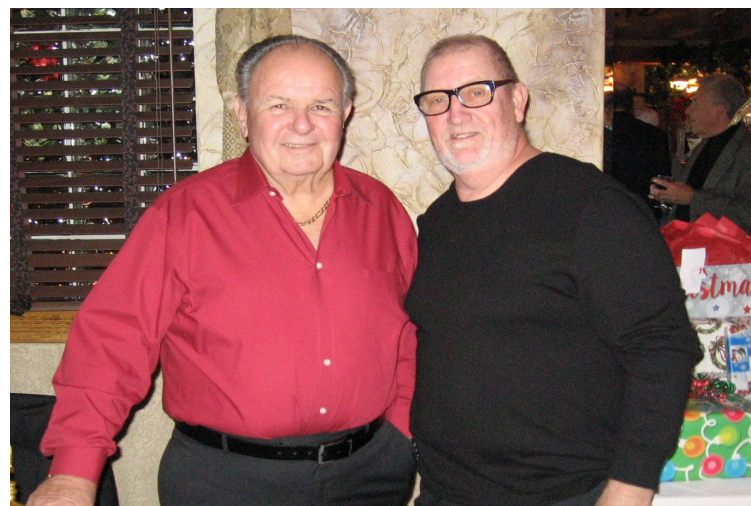

## Tech Tips

### Easier Starting for Your 57

This is an oldie that was originally given to me by our former member, Ken Herb. If you start your car during the winter layover it can help.

For 1957 Tbirds with a Holley two or four bbl carb (not the 55-56 teapot and without an electric fuel pump) here is a technique for starting the engine when your car has been idle for an extended period of time. This technique avoids having to crank the engine continuously until the fuel pump has filled the carb. Do the following:

After reconnecting the battery and cranking the engine over for 15 seconds or so to get the oil circulating, you can partially fill the carb front bowl by hand with enough fuel to start the engine. You will need a small container with a spout thin enough to fit in the carb's vent tube. I use a sewing machine oil bottle that I purchased. A thin basting tube would be another choice.

Fill the container with a couple of ounces of fuel and then put the fuel in the carb's front bowl vent tube. Then hit the gas pedal a couple of times to set the choke and to "prime" the engine and away you go. The engine should start immediately and runs long enough for the fuel pump to catch up.

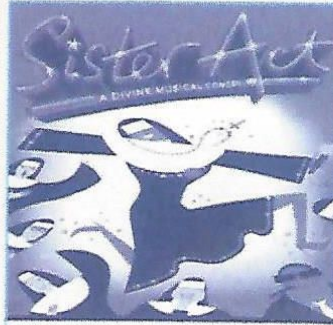
