— Packing List —

December 14-17, 2018

The Basics:

- Clean, comfortable and casual clothing for each day. Please pack temperature appropriate clothing - think layers! Seattle/Lynnwood will have different climates than Spokane...
- Don't forget clean undergarments (underwear, tee-shirts, bras).
- Be sure to bring comfortable shoes for walking and during long rehearsals and clinics. And also bring some flip flops for the pool, if you're planning on swimming.
- Oh, and you'll need a swimming suit, if you're planning to swim.
- Pack your toothbrush, tooth paste, razor, towels, soap, face wash, shampoo / conditioner, brush, hair ties, deodorant, make up, contact solution, etc.

Performance Attire and Accessories:

WOMEN (garment bag optional):

- Your choir dress, hopefully cleaned sometime in the last 12 months...
- Black, closed-toed shoes
- Appropriate, minimalist jewelry.
- Necessary hair ties, clips, etc. to ensure your hair is out of your face during performances.
- Optional: static guard, lint roller.

MEN (in your garment bag):

- Your complete, clean tuxedo, hanging inside your LABELED garment bag. This includes:
 - Black tuxedo pants.
 - Black tuxedo jacket.
 - White tuxedo shirt.
 - Black tuxedo shoes.
 - Black or dark grey socks (2 pair).
 - Bow tie.
 - Cummerbund.
 - 4 studs (black and silver).
 - 2 cufflinks (black and silver).
- Optional: lint roller.

Music Things:

- Bring all your choir music.
- Pack at least two pencils.
- You might want to bring Post-It Notes and/or a few highlighters for important information from rehearsals.
- Pack a water bottle - you'll want it for long rehearsals and for the bus ride!
