

CEMETERY TOMB WORK

Since last September four tombs have been cleaned and the masonry on another restored by Bayou Restoration Group of New Orleans. Pierre Masonry also cleaned two tombs and repaired the large tomb of the Beatty family (most of whom died in the Last Island Hurricane of 1856). A workshop was held to demonstrate tomb cleaning. The repair and restoration continue, thanks partly to Peltier and Lorio Foundation grants and to member contributions. David Cassard, the Cemetery Warden, oversees and records the work for the vestry.

There are multiple fence/gate problems caused by damage from cars, improper repair over the years, or oak tree roots growing into the fence.
