Dear Friends,

Greetings to you in the mighty and holy name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer. As always, I trust God that this message finds you in good health and high spirits, rejoicing in the joy of the Lord and experiencing the peace of Christ that surpasses all human understanding. I also pray that we continually grow in God's grace and knowledge.

The familiar lyrics of a favorite hymn, "Our God is an awesome God. He reigns from heaven above with power and love," is a fitting way to begin the liturgical year. This is partly true because the beautiful words effectively connect the hopeful message of God's sovereignty celebrated on Christ the King Sunday, which marks the conclusion of the liturgical calendar, with the joyous themes of Advent and Christmas, which signal the calendar's beginning.

It is characteristic of God, who often works through the most unlikely individuals and extraordinary circumstances, to guide those before us to bookend the Christian (liturgical) calendar with hope by emphasizing God's sovereignty. Perhaps the calendar's order is another example of God's omniscience. He knows people need hope and reassurance of God's constant sovereign presence.

As we journey through Advent and Christmas, the themes of —Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love—become deeply meaningful. These themes are a source of inspiration and a reminder of God's active presence and concern for creation. Advent and Christmas are the most joyous times of the Christian calendar, filled with anticipation and the call for intentional reflection, culminating in the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ – the fulfillment of God's promise to send a Savior to ransom fallen humanity from the power and consequence of sin, and to make it possible for everyone to be reconciled to God, their creator through the birth of the baby Jesus, the suffering death, resurrection, and ascension of the God-man Jesus Christ.

Advent and Christmas lead us through a spiritual journey that rekindles our faith and reinforces our belief that trouble does not always last and that the sun will shine again because God is alive, actively involved in our lives, and deeply concerned about His creation. This season is a powerful reminder that we are not alone; we are enveloped in the love and grace of the only true, wise, ever-present, and sovereign God, the light of the world Who lights the path ahead with unwavering hope.







Christmas

Every year, around the world, people celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day, 25 December. It's a day – and season – filled with Christmas carols, tree decorating, gift-giving and parties. And, among all the celebrations, you may be wondering: what is the real meaning of Christmas? Or, why do we have these Christmas traditions? What do they have to do with Jesus?

Our lives, country and world are far from perfect. There are always challenges and struggles we face both personally and collectively. The good news of Christmas is that even when the world or our circumstances change – the message of Christmas is timeless. Because Christmas is about the birth of God's Son – Jesus. It is about how he came to give us love, hope and joy. That message doesn't change from year to year. When there is so much bad

news and devastation in the world, this is good news worth celebrating!

The Christmas story in the Bible

Around Christmas time, angels feature prominently. They adorn treetops and Christmas cards, and have starring roles in Christmas carols and plays. That's because angels were God's messengers to share the good news of Jesus' birth to Mary, Joseph and the shepherds.

In a display of the importance of women, the angel Gabriel first appeared to a young woman called Mary. He told her that she was chosen to be the mother of Jesus - that is, she would give birth to the Son of God.

God also assures us that he is always working to bring good out of all that happens in our lives. Life is full of stress, anxiety, worries and struggles but God says he will never leave us or waver from his love for us. And while his love is for everyone, God waits for us to ask him to help us in our troubles.

The meaning of Christmas is good news for all people

Immanuel, which means "God with us" (Matthew chapter 1: verse 23, NIV Bible), is another name for Jesus. His birth and life is a message of good news for us because it means we are never alone. It doesn't matter how hard or hopeless our situation may appear to be, God is there for us. We don't have to journey through our challenges and struggles alone. He understands them. He walks them alongside us.

Why do we celebrate Christmas?

Celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ is more than a Christian holiday or Christian festival. It is more than an occasion to decorate our houses.

It is an opportunity to pause and give thanks for the love, hope and joy found in Jesus – our Savior and friend. As we exchange gifts with loved ones, it is out of remembrance of the gift God gave us in Jesus. The gift that we are loved, are never alone and can have hope for the future.

May you sense the peace the Savior of the world brought to earth one Christmas morning long ago. Merry Christmas and God bless you! CHRISTMAS begins with







Are You Ready for Christmas?

Theme: Preparing for Christ's coming

Object: An Advent calendar or regular calendar

Scripture: Luke 3:1-6

Look at that! (Show the calendar.) There are only [number of days] until Christmas! Are you ready? That's a question we hear quite often these days, isn't it? What do people mean when they ask if you're ready for Christmas? (Pause for responses.)



They might wonder what you need to do to be ready. So what do you need to do to be ready for Christmas? (Pause.) But what I wonder is, are you ready for Christ?


In our Bible lesson today, we hear the voice of John the Baptist crying out to the people, "Prepare the way for the Lord. Fill in the valleys and level off all the mountains. Make the crooked roads straight and the rough places smooth."

Do you think John the Baptist really wanted the people to work on the roads? (Pause.) What John really wanted was for the people to get ready for the coming of the Messiah, Jesus Christ. He was telling people to get their hearts right and return to God.

No matter how good people may think they are, there are always some crooked ways and rough places in their lives. There are things such as dishonesty, selfishness, pride, jealousy, and many more. John wanted the people to make those crooked ways straight in preparation for Jesus' coming.


During the Christmas season, we, too, can prepare by looking at our hearts and smoothing out rough places like dishonesty and selfishness. And the good news is, God will help us. Let's ask Him to do that right now.










