Biography

Michael "Mick" Stuart Crowe, age 70, of Harbor Beach, passed away Thursday, March 31, 2022 at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit from complications with his heart. Mick was born on September 6, 1951, to Ernest and Georgina (Reeves) Crowe. He grew up in Dartford England, in the country of Kent in the United Kingdom. He married Denise Marie Thayer on December 16, 2006. Mick attended Temple Hill Primary School and then The Downs Secondary School. After leaving school he began a career in Sales; Kipling (Cakes), Walls (Groceries), and Beadles (Cars). He was a good salesman just like his father. In due course Mick also had a successful career with The Docklands Light Railway in London, England. Having met Denise, the love of his life, Mick immediately new his future was with her and moved to the United States. They ventured into business together and bought an Ice Cream Restaurant (The Crowe's Harbor Beach Anchorage) in Harbor Beach which they owned and operated together for 12 years. Mick also worked at Valley Enterprise, Gemini Group in Ubly. Mick was sociable and good company with a keen sense of humor and fun. He was called a true Englishman, a gentleman, a great bloke, a top geezer, a master of banter, he had honest wit and wasn't afraid to share it. There was always laughter when he was around. When living in

Dartford he enjoyed the local pub (The Temple Belle), where he was instrumental in raising a lot of money for local charities. One of the stunts was being pushed in a hospital bed all through town. Mick loved anything on wheels and especially his Goldwing Trike. He couldn't wait for summer to ride. He also loved music. He was an encyclopedia of knowledge for the 60's, 70's and 80's. He could tell you the name of the band, the singers and who they were married to! Most people could find him riding through Harbor Beach all summer long on his trike playing his music going back and forth to work no matter what temperature it was.
