

Leadership Team Report

A representative of Prudential Investments briefed the Team on the status of the Bethany portfolio that they manage and that has been designated by the church as its means of self-insurance in case of flooding. Changes that we had approved the last time we met with Pruco – increased investments in technology issues and the addition of a small amount of gold to the portfolio - have worked out nicely. Returns have, on the whole, been healthy. Prudential's most immediate concern with the overall market is the strong potential for interest rates to rise, which would have the concomitant effect of lowering bond prices. In our case, that would tend to devalue a significant portion of the fixed-income sector of our investments. This is addressable by our managers, and, in fact, the balance change to be described next is a simultaneous move to do that and improve our portfolio's equity growth in the long term. We decided, therefore, to tweak our investment balance toward somewhat higher risk in order to try for better returns without significantly reducing safety. Right now, our Pruco portfolio is at 45% conservative / 55% aggressive, but, following some discussion, and acting in part on the counsel of the representative, the Team voted to change the risk profile from 45 conservative / 55 aggressive to 40 conservative / 60 aggressive.

We are going to investigate what is legally stated and allowed to be done with the principal and proceeds of the Raudenbush Trust. The goal is to see if we can turn that money more toward the general benefit of the church without violating the usage stipulations of the Raudenbush family at the Fund's inception. The fund is very old, so a statute of limitations as to its originally prescribed uses may apply.

The Team agreed on the color of the mat needed for the Center Street inside entryway. The ash gray color for it was accepted by unanimous voice vote (Dorothy moving, Mike seconding).

Of special note is that the ongoing church-wide loose change collection will henceforth be directed to supporting the Community Meals that we help sponsor rather than to the Salvation Army.

We need to begin considering how and when we will manage this year's Hanging of the Greens.

A recently-discovered development is that plaster is falling from the walls and ceilings on the 2nd floor of the Parish House, and there's a need to address that as soon as possible. One looming question is whether those areas have asbestos from early construction.



Trustees Report

We are getting acclimated to the new Bethany. While it's a beautiful and functional space, we are still working through a few things that need to be adjusted, repaired, etc. The inspectors conducting the final walk through inspection for the occupancy permit pointed out some items that needed to be changed or added. The architect and contractor are currently either making the changes or are researching the appropriate requirements to see if we have any wiggle room. In addition, some of the exterior doors need adjusted and the sound system needs some tweaking. The refrigerator and freezer in the kitchen were not operating properly, probably from being in storage so long, so a technician from K&D Factory Service came and made the necessary adjustments and repairs.

In addition, we are still missing or need to purchase some additional furniture and equipment. The chairs for the Fellowship Hall have not arrived (thanks to St. Andrew's for loaning us some to use). Susquehanna Fire Equipment, when recently inspecting our fire extinguishers, recommended a Class K extinguisher for the kitchen, which was approved for purchase. On a recent rainy Sunday morning it became apparent we need a mat inside the Center Street entrance. Clarkson Chemical, who we purchased our mats from previously, has measured the area and left a catalog for the Leadership Team to review and choose from. Now that we will soon have cooler temperatures, Shelly recently pointed out that we don't have coat racks and umbrella stands at the entrances. Those will need purchased.

There is still quite a lot of non-salvageable items and material in the basement that will need to carried out and put in a dumpster. If anyone knows of a Scout Troop or Church Youth Group that is looking for a service project, this would be a good one!

The Leadership Team had an informative presentation from John at Hudock Capital prior to our August meeting. This month, Greg from Prudential will provide an update regarding our investments at 6:00 PM prior to our regularly scheduled meeting on September 21.

I spoke with Ben from Hillside Roofing earlier this month. He said it would still be a couple more weeks until they can start on the Parish House roof. Hopefully the project will be able to be completed this month.


