
# **WEXFORD WEST NEWSLETTER: MAY & JUNE 2020**

### **FRIENDLY REMINDERS:**

**-SIGNAGE:** Please be aware that the only signs that are allowed within the neighborhood are: Home FOR SALE signs/Open house signs on day of event, garage sale signs on day of event, and security signs. Aside from those three things, no signage is allowed in the neighborhood. With the upcoming election, we would like to remind everyone that the rules do not allow signs to be posted. This information is part of our <u>General</u> <u>Restrictions-Section 7</u>.

**-LITTERING IN PARK:** We all have a responsibility to help keep our neighborhood beautiful. Please pick up after yourself and your guests at the park.

The **BUFO** toad is a huge brown to grayish-brown toad and generally range in size from 6 to 9in+. Bufo toads are seen mostly during the rainy season (late May to mid-October) and most often at night.

If confronted by dogs, cats or other animals it releases a white toxic venom from the glands on the back. **THIS TOXIN CAN KILL ANIMALS**. These are not indigenous and if found/confirmed should be correctly euthanized.
