Turners Island Tak Trip Wednesday April 25, 2018

We arrived at Santa Cruz Island and searched for schools of yellowtail and white seabass. Our captain John spotted a few fish here and there, but none were ready to bite. After driving around for a while finally decided to work the kelp beds. Not much at first, but after a while we drew the calicos out and some white seabass along with them. The fish was only eating the plastics and left the fin bait alone. Ernie hooked the 1st white seabass and after a great gag job by the deck hand got it into the boat and into the sack. Shortly thereafter, Don Merrill hooked a white seabass and got it up to the boat and lost it as it was being gaffed. A few minutes later Henry Castro hooked another white seabass but also lost it at the boat. The calicos were biting really well all this time and after a while we made several other stops on kelp but never as good as the 1st one. At the end of the day we searched for yellows and found a big school breaking water under a bunch of birds. Most everybody was throwing surface irons, but no fish were being caught. As captain John was announcing we were heading home, Ernie who was dropper looping with two anchovies and a squid head was hit hard by a roving yellow and was able to bring it aboard. All in all, it was a very successful trip, and all had fun. Close to limits of calicos, 1 white seabass and 1 yellowtail was the count for the day. Calico jackpot went to Ernie 3lb 8oz and money jackpot went to Ernie for biggest fish white seabass.
