

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

Holy Name Society: Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Joseph Chimenti

THREE PERSONS IN ONE GOD

Because God is a triune God, God is organically in relationship



with others. It is natural, for love and mercy are key qualities of god's being. How can you be loving and merciful without an object for that love and mercy? No wonder God—and the wisdom of God—loved "playing on the surface of his earth...(finding) delight in the human race" (Proverbs 8:31). Recall that God is portrayed walking through the garden of Eden before the fall, eager to interact with the first man and

woman. But even before God had anyone on earth to love, God could direct love and faithfulness to other members of the Trinity.

God constantly draws us into relationship. Living in relationship is foundational to the Trinity, so naturally God wishes to live in relationship with us. Jesus lived His life creating and deepening relationships with others: spending His days with His friends (bringing them with him all over Galilee), sharing His deepest concerns with them (telling them He would die and rise again), and caring for their well-being (calming the storm, raising Lazarus). The Father and Son sent the Holy Spirit to come down upon us and remain with us forever in a most intimate relationship. In this way, we are enabled to live constantly in a loving relationship with God.

When we recite the creed, we affirm our faith in the Trinity. In a way, it is like wedding vows. When we marry, we are saying to our spouse that we believe in them and that we wish to enter a loving, lasting relationship with them. We do the same in the creed, made more apparent with the words "I believe in" repeated for each member of the Trinity.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:


As a pilgrim of hope during this Jubilee Year, how does knowing God as three persons in one deepen the hope that I have in God?

Up to the Job

Have you ever had a job for which you didn't feel qualified? I think we all have, whether it was a paying gig or not. A lot of us parents often feel in awe of the magnitude of that role and lose sleep worrying that we made the wrong decision in one situation or a bad call in another. Some of us feel intimidated by what our communities need from us, on the parish level or in our personal relationships. Or maybe we are simply dreading a task that seems too big, too overwhelming — that necessary basement cleanout, or the weekly organization of family schedules.

When we don't feel qualified, we don't want to do the work. We get stuck in our own fear. That's the birthplace of procrastination, self-doubt and bitterness. When we look inward at our own abilities, we can only see all the traits that aren't there. The intelligence, the dexterity, the ambition — whatever it is we lack, we get stuck on it.

I've got good news and bad news. I'll start with the bad news: none of us are qualified for the call of discipleship. We simply aren't. We don't have the love or grace or strength to get the job done.

Now I'll give you the good news: God knows this, and He doesn't care. Stewardship does not insist that we possess every good quality — no, as a way of life, stewardship recognizes that we lack *so many* qualities. But it shows us where to find the love and grace and strength we need. Stewardship does not demand that we know every answer; it merely reminds us who to ask when we don't.
