

Charlie died in his sleep Tuesday, July 12, 2016, shortly after returning from his annual trip to Stratford, Ontario, at the age of 81.

He was born Nov. 16, 1934 in Sebewaing, and graduated from Sebewaing High School.

After serving in the Navy on the USS Cony (DD/DDE-508), he attended the University of Michigan and earned a degree in economics. He was a proud and loyal Michigan fan. He later finished his Juris Doctorate at the Detroit College of Law, and retired from the State of Michigan Attorney General's office.

By far, Charlie's greatest passion was music. He played his trumpet with various bands in Sebewaing and Lansing, and took every opportunity to be part of a jam session. His trumpet went with him everywhere and will be buried with him in the Liken family plot in Sebewaing.

Besides music, Charlie's passion was animals.
