Events Center

There are two plans for the Events center you should be aware of:

To provide appropriate care and protect public health, the County of San Mateo is utilizing space at the San Mateo County Event Center to house individuals in RVs who need alternative housing to self-isolate and do not warrant hospitalization. The Event Center, like all fairground sites in state, is designated by the California Office of Emergency Services as a location that can be utilized for emergency response purposes. Twenty RVs brought to the site will provide safe and secure temporary housing for up to 20 people housed individually. Each has kitchen and bathroom facilities. Staff from the Human Services Agency will provide round-the-clock on-site support while County Health will monitor each individual's medical needs. This presents no danger to Fiesta Gardens residents and provides an essential service to our community by

2. The State is working to set up a drive-thru testing facility in the parking lot at the south end of the property. Preparations are underway, and testing has begun. This is going to be set up as an appointment-only facility, and CHP is supposed to be providing traffic and security resources. Police and Fire are aware and are working to coordinate logistics the medical personnel and CHP. More information on this to come as we get it.

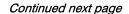

Other guidelines:

- There is NO NEED to hoard or panic buy. Grocery stores and other businesses serving critical needs will remain open. Panic buying just means someone else will go in need. Those more vulnerable in our population will suffer because of this unsocial behavior.
- HELP your neighbor. The elderly are particularly vulnerable to this disease. Offer to buy groceries for the neighbor that would be at high risk if exposed.
- WASH your hands regularly and try not to touch your face.
- COVID-19 is spread through direct contact with infected people and by respiratory droplets when an infected

person coughs or sneezes. COVER your mouth/nose when you cough/sneeze. Stay ~6ft away from people to prevent droplet transmission.

- 5. The virus may spread on surfaces, but the data is incomplete. Outside surfaces are likely safer as they are exposed to natural UV light that kills the virus. Good hand washing and frequent wipe down of high traffic surfaces is good practice until we know more about this form of transmission.
- 6. You DON'T need a mask unless you are a health worker or infected. Most people use/fit masks incorrectly and do not change them frequently enough to be effective. Buying tons of masks depletes the supplies for healthcare workers. When healthcare workers get sick due to lack of equipment, who will look after you when you get sick?
- 7. If you think you have COVID-19 call your doctor first. Infected people going to the hospital is not good. If you have acute symptoms requiring immediate hospitalization, then call 911.
- 8. There is no need to buy more guns and ammunition. I will give \$1000 to the first person that can prove to me that shooting a virus will kill it!
- 9. Be a good neighbor, read a good book, watch a great movie. Make the most of a bad situation.
