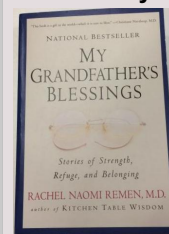

Treating colds the "natural" way

- WASH YOUR HANDS
- DON'T SNIFF (MAKES THE BAD STUFF GO BACK IN) Blow one nostril at a time putting gentle pressure on the other side.

- DON'T FLY Bad for your ears and respiratory system. (AND CATCHING THINGS)

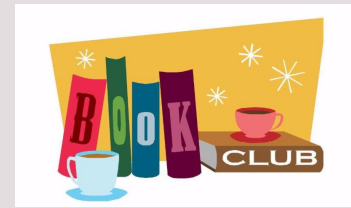
