# LET THIS MIND BE IN YOU

**T**he mind as defined by the Oxford dictionary is “the element of a person that enables them to be aware of the world and their experiences, to think and to feel; the faculty of consciousness and the thought.”

Your mind therefore refers to your thinking or your thought, opinion and this translates to your attitude, it becomes your act.

We are told in the bible the kind of mind we should have, what our thinking should be and if we need to express our opinion, our feelings, our thoughts it should align with that of our Lord Jesus Christ because He is our perfect example in all things.

Phil 2v5 says “Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus.”

Phil 2v5-11 [NLT] ‘You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had, though He was God, He did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. Instead, He gave up His divine privileges, He took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When He appeared in human form, He humbled Himself in obedience to God and died a criminal’s death on a cross. Therefore God elevated him to the place of highest honor and gave him the name above all other names, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the father.’

What then is the mind of Christ?

The summary of the mind of Christ as stated in our key scripture is “HE HUMBLED HIMSELF”

The mind of humility is the mind of Christ. This is the bedrock upon which other manifestations of the mind of

Christ rest. We shall be considering in this article how Jesus manifested His mind of humility that is to say how Jesus acted out his mind of humility. Put in another way since we express our mind through attitudes and actions we shall see how Jesus demonstrated His humility and how He expects us His children to do same.

**1. Mind of forgiveness** – The humble finds it easy to forgive. When we are offended our ego is brushed and the natural man reacts in various ways. Jesus forgave our sins in spite of all we did to Him. And He is still forgiving. We must continue to forgive one another. Jesus taught us to pray in Matthew 6v12 ‘And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us’ Ephesians 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ’s sake hath forgiven you’

Jesus further encouraged us to forgive one another when He told the parable in Matthew 18v 23-35

‘Then the Lord, after he had called him said unto him, O thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all that debt... shouldst not thou also have had compassion on thy fellow servant, even as I had pity on thee? And his Lord was wroth and delivered him to the tormentors... so likewise shall my heavenly father do also unto you if ye from your hearts forgive not everyone his brother their trespasses.’

The mind of Christ is the mind of forgiveness.

**2. Mind of Gratitude.** We express humility when we show gratitude. Jesus and His father [God] are one, yet Jesus was always thanking God for everything.

- He thanked God for the good,
- He thanked God for the bad,

- He thanked God at the grave side,

Joh 11:41 Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead was laid. And Jesus lifted up his eyes, and said, Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard me.

- He thanked God when He needed to feed so many people and there was little provision

Joh 6:11 And Jesus took the loaves; and when he had given thanks, he distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to them that were set down; and likewise of the fishes as much as they would.

- He thanked God for every little thing.

1Th 5:18 In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.

**3. Mind of obedience.** Jesus was obedient to the point of death.

Phlp 2:8 And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

- He was obedient when it was shameful ( death of the cross)
- He was obedient when painful
- He was obedient when it was difficult
- He surrendered to the will of God even in agony.

Mat 26:39 And he went a little further, and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt.

We must be obedient to the commandments of God at all times, in all situations and circumstances.

Mary said to the disciples in Joh 2:5 ... Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it. This is what obedience means.

**4. Mind of love.** God is love. The coming of Jesus into the world demonstrated God’s love towards us. Jesus demonstrated His love for the Father by submitting to Him at all times.

Joh 3:16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Jesus Himself enjoined us to love one another as He loves us.

Joh 13:34 A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

John 13:35 By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

John 15:12 This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you.

John 15:17 These things I command you, that ye love one another.

**5. Esteeming one another.** Phil 2:3-4 Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves. Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others.

[NLT] Don't be selfish, don't try to impress others, Be humble, thinking of others better than yourselves. Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others too

Jesus was always promoting God the Father.

Luke 18:19 And Jesus said unto him, Why callest thou me good? none is good, save one, that is, God.

**6. Mind of service.** Php 2:7 But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the

likeness of men:

Jesus served His Father and equally served His disciples.

John 13:14 -16 If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet.

For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you. Verily, verily, I say unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him.

### **BENEFITS OF HAVING THE MIND OF CHRIST**

**1. The humble shall be exalted.** God exalted Jesus.

Php 2:9 -11 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:

That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;

And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

We shall be exalted too when we humble ourselves

Luk 14:11 For whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

**2. The humble shall receive grace**

Jas 4:6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble.

### **3. The humble will have their desires granted**

Psa 10:17 LORD, thou hast heard the desire of the humble: thou wilt prepare their heart, thou wilt cause thine ear to hear:

### **4. The humble will be honored**

Pro 29:23 A man's pride shall bring him low: but honour shall uphold the humble in spirit.

### **5. The humble shall enjoy divine presence**

Isa 57:15 For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

### **6. The humble shall be the greatest in God's kingdom**

Mat 18:4 Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, the same is greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

HOW DO YOU KNOW HOW A MAN THINKS? Matt. 12:34(b)

(AMP) ...For out of the fullness (the overflow, the superabundance) of the heart the mouth speaks.

(BBE) ...Because out of the heart's store come the words of the mouth.

(CEV) ...Your words show what is in your hearts.

(GNB) ...For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of.

(KJV) for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh.

(NLT) ...whatever is in your heart determines what you say.

NASV: "For the mouth speaks out of that which fills the heart".  
TLB: "For a man's heart determines his speech".

The easiest way to know how a man thinks is to listen to what he speaks (says). You will then discover that the things a man says will be easily seen in his business, marriage, spiritual life etc. Thought creates character.

Pro 18:20 A man's belly shall be satisfied with the fruit of his mouth; and with the increase of his lips shall he be filled.

Pro 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.

GNB Pro 18:20 You will have to live with the consequences of everything you say.

Pro 18:21 What you say can preserve life or destroy it; so you must accept the consequences of your words.

What gives the tongue and mouth power is the heart.

A man will live with the consequence of what he says.

Whether or not you will become what God has ordained you to be will be determined by your thinking which will be reflected in what you say.

Let us look at the story of people that suffered the consequences of their worst:  
Num. 13: 1-2: Moses instructed to send out spies.

Num. 13: 25-27: Joint vet communiqué

After this, two groups were formed and what distinguished the two groups was their thinking.

GROUP 1: Evil Reporters

People that were already defeated in their hearts before they spoke out.

Num 13:28-33 Nevertheless the people be strong that dwell in the land, and the cities are walled, and very great: and moreover we saw the children of Anak there.

The Amalekites dwell in the land of the south: and the Hittites, and the Jebusites, and the



Amorites, dwell in the mountains: and the Canaanites dwell by the sea, and by the coast of Jordan.

But the men that went up with him said, We be not able to go up against the people; for they are stronger than we.

And they brought up an evil report of the land which they had searched unto the children of Israel, saying, The land, through which we have gone to search it, is a land that eateth up the inhabitants thereof; and all the people that we saw in it are men of a great stature.

And there we saw the giants, the sons of Anak, which come of the giants: and we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight.

Makes you to see only giants and fenced cities.

Makes you to always murmur and envy others.

Could make you to backslide (back to Egypt).

Attracts the anger of God.

God's response to evil reporters:

Num 14:28 Say unto them, As truly as I live, saith the LORD, as ye have spoken in mine ears, so will I do to you:

Because they said they were not able to possess their possession, God agreed with them and they all died in the wilderness without possessing their possession.

GROUP 2:  
Good Report (Faith) Num. 13:30; 14:24.

Num 13:30

(KJV) And Caleb stilled the people before Moses, and said, Let us go up at once, and possess it; for we are well able to overcome it.

(CEV) Caleb calmed down the crowd and said, "Let's go and take the land. I know we can do it!"

(MSG) Caleb interrupted, called for silence before Moses and said, "Let's go up and take the land--now. We can do it."

(NLT) But Caleb tried to quiet the people as they stood before Moses. "Let's go at once to take the land," he said. "We can certainly conquer it!"

**BIBLE READING: LUKE 21 : 32 - 36.**

**O**ur God is a God of plan and purpose. The creation of man had a beginning (Genesis 1 : 26 – 28 ) and the existence of man on earth will surely have an end. We should not be ignorant of the end-times. The end-time did not start in 1975 neither is it 1975 as some heretical teachers and so-called witnesses falsely teach. The end-time is also not an allegory used in scripture to describe when things are not going on well for an individual. The Bible presents the end-time as the period of time that ushers in the return of Jesus Christ. We should not be deceived; neither should we allow anyone to deceive us. Matthew 24 : 4 clearly warns us against this :

“And Jesus answered and said unto them, Take heed that no man deceive you.”

We are in the end-times. Going through recent historic events in the Middle East and making critical comparisons with prophetic utterances made by our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, coupled with prophecies of other prophets in

scriptures, we can say we have reached a critical period in human history. By going diligently through scriptures, a good student of the Bible can say with certainty that present world events point at one thing: “The coming of our Lord and Saviour – Jesus Christ, is at hand”. It is true that no man knows exactly when Christ shall come ( Matthew 24 : 36 ), it will therefore be unscriptural to try to calculate the year, day or time when Christ shall return. At the same time, we shouldn't be ignorant of signs of the end-times ( Matthew 16 : 3 ). The present situation of greed and lust that dominates human hearts, the financial, economic and industrial problems, as well as the spirit of selfishness that grips mankind, are all pointing to the fact that the terminus will soon be reached (2 Timothy 3 : 2 – 4 ). The Bible details many other end-time signs which include: mass suffering and destruction ( Matthew 24 : 7 – 9 ), decline of morals and problems of mass corruption (Matthew 24 :12), mind control and undue standardisation of thought and behaviour ( 2 Thessalonians 2 : 11 – 12 ) and the return of the Jews from captivity. We are in the end-times because history confirms that the

twentieth century alone witnessed the fulfilment of the aforementioned signs. If there is a time to be watchful and to keep our stand as Christians, it is now, in this end-time. An end-time Christian is therefore that Christian who is ready to live and die for Christ and the expansion of His kingdom. Such a person has a deep unwavering conviction that Jesus Christ is Lord, is committed to violent ministration against evil ( Matthew 11 : 12 ), the ministration of knowledge and the wisdom of God ( Proverbs 4 : 5 ) and the ministration of worship, holiness, love and joy in the Holy Spirit ( Romans 14 :17 – 18 ). Are you an end-time Christian?

# THINK LOVELY, BE OF GOOD REPORT

'...brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, WHATSOEVER THINGS ARE OF GOOD REPORT...think on these things.

What you think or what goes on in your mind is what you speak out. In order to give a good report, we must start by thinking of it just as said in the above scripture. When you think it, you will speak it.

The word of God admonishes us to also deal with our tongue. The tongue is said to be the smallest organ of the body, and yet it is the hardest one to keep under control. As Children of God, named after Christ [CHRISTIAN] we have to work diligently to tame our tongue.

"Likewise the tongue is the smallest part of the body, but it brings great boast." (NIV James 3:5) The tongue has the ability to defile the entire body. It has more power than an individual can imagine. "And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, which it defileth the whole body and setteth on fire the course of nature." (KJV James 3:6)

We must strive to put our tongue into positive use at all times.. "Death and life are in the power of the tongue..." (KJV Proverbs 18:21).

There are ways we can use our tongue and it will be unacceptable before God.

Psalm 19:14 Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer.

Whenever we have the privilege to give a report on one another or pass a comment on a fellow brethren, we should avoid derogatory and discrediting report as we know that words are powerful.

Colossians 4:6 Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person.

We must always be careful and verify information before we pass it on [IF WE HAVE TO]. Sometimes we are too quick to spread words that come to us. Psalm 37:30 The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom, and his tongue speaks justice. Any untrue story becomes a foolish and unjust talk. May we not be condemned before God our maker in Jesus name. Matthew 15:11 It is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but what comes out of the mouth; this defiles a person."

Let us prayerfully ruminate over the following scripture.

Proverbs 21:23 Whoever keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble.

Ephesians 4:29 Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those

who hear.

Psalm 34:13 Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking deceit.

James 1:26 If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless.

Proverbs 17:28 Even a fool who keeps silent is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is deemed intelligent

1 Peter 3:10 For "Whoever desires to love life and see good days, let him keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit;

Proverbs 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits

Proverbs 10:19 When words are many, transgression is not lacking, but whoever restrains his lips is prudent

Titus 3:2 To speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people.

In conclusion, we must continue to pray as David did in Psalm 141:3 'Set a guard, O Lord, over my mouth; keep watch over the door of my lips!' AMEN.



### **Acts 16:23-26.**

This story shows the unfair arrest of Paul and Silas. They were arrested because they did good; they had cast a spirit of divination out of a girl, the local Philippian authorities beat them and then jailed them. Besides the problem of the severe beating, they were chained with their arms and legs clamped in an immobile position, so that they won't move. It may be that the prison was more like the resemblance of a dungeon.

Yet, in spite of the pains in their bodies and the disheartening atmosphere, at midnight

supernatural and into the power of God. "Blessed is the people that know the joyful sound: they shall walk, O LORD, in the light of thy countenance" (Psalms 89:15)

There are many actions involved with praise to God — verbal expressions of adoration and thanksgiving, singing, playing instruments, shouting, dancing, lifting or clapping our hands. But true praise is not "merely" going through these motions. Genuine praise to God is a matter of humility and sincere devotion to the Lord from within. This is what it means to Be full of praise! Be full of praise!!

3. Praise sets the enemy running. Since praise manifests God's presence, we also realize that praise repels the presence of the enemy, Satan. An atmosphere which is filled with sincere worship and praise to God by humble and contrite hearts is a threat to the Devil. He fears the power in the name of Jesus, and flees from the Lord's habitation in praise. "Whoso offereth praise glorifieth me: and to him that ordereth his conversation aright will I show the salvation of God" (Psalms 50:23).

### **What is Praise?**

### **Why should we be full of praise?**

1. Praise Lifts you above and beyond your troubles. Paul and Silas knew the secret of how to lift their hearts above their troubles and enter into God's presence and power. Through praise and worship their hearts were raised into the joyous presence and peace of God, and provided God a channel for his power to operate in their circumstances.

2. Praise attracts the presence of God. The Bible says that God inhabits the praises of His people Psalm. 22:3 In other words, God "dwells" in the atmosphere of His praise. This means that praise is not merely a reaction from coming into His presence - Praise is a vehicle of faith which brings us into the presence and power of God! Praise and worship is the "gate-pass" which allows us to enter the sacredness of His glory. Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name" (Psalms 100:4).

armies of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, King Jehoshaphat and all the people sought the Lord for His help. The Lord assured the people that this would be His battle. He told them to go out against them, and He would do the fighting for them. So what did the children of Judah do? Being the people of "praise" (Judah actually means Praise), and knowing that God manifests His power through praise, they sent their army against their enemies, led by the praise leaders. (2Chronicles 20:22) They experienced uncommon Victory over their enemies.

When you begin to praise his name, it sends the enemy running! I urge you to become a person of praise, and you will experience the release of the power of God into your life.

Therefore, be full of praise.

did. He showed kindness to the outcasts. He was always humble even though He was the Son of God. All He did on earth was to glorify His Heavenly Father. He came to serve and not to be served despite the fact that He was the Son of the most high.

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service.<sup>2</sup> And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." (NKJV). ("12<sup>1-2</sup> So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life - your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life - and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you." – The message version)<sup>3</sup> For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith. (Romans 12:1-3 NKJV)

The word "mind" as discussed in the above verses is not only referring to just an attitude neither is it being referred to as just a mere concept, but Paul in His admonition to the Romans, used this word mainly in the verb form, referring to the "mind of Christ" as an action, something in-the-doing. So as a believer in Christ Jesus, born again children of God, we should endeavor to demonstrate a life that reflects the mind of Christ not just in words but mostly by our actions within and without the Christian circle. It is a known believe that action speaks louder than voice;

this fact is especially true in the way we live our everyday life as a believer in the Lord Jesus.

Phil 2:3-4 states "Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than themselves. Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others." (KJV). This simply means as renewed and transformed believer, you have to exercise the act of putting others before yourself, using the acronym JOY (Jesus, others and yourself), we are sure to find JOY in the Lord when we choose to do things God's way. As believers we are called to complement each other in the fold of Christ not for competition, thus putting somebody else first, will ignite the act of constantly praying for each other and doing whatever possible in our capacity in making sure that our fellow believer succeeds in his/her calling and walk with God.

Our selfish self is always saying "me, me, it's all about me," but Paul is admonishing us here again, that if we want to be transformed while renewing our minds, we must be willing to disgratify the flesh and allow the mind of Christ to be made manifest through and within us. Just as Jesus exemplified for us by leaving behind His glorious throne in heaven and taking the form of the sinful man, bore the shame and died for our sins on the cross of Calvary, to reconcile us back to God.

Despite an individual's past life history, it is possible for us to live a renewed and transformed life, below are ways we can use to renew our minds:

## 1. Constant meditation in the word of God.

Renewing the mind is an ongoing process. Every day we need to take time to study the Word so we can purposely think according to what it says. "My soul is consumed with longing for your laws at all times. Your statutes are my delight; they are my counselors" (Ps. 119:20, 24, NIV). Like the psalmist, we can find joy and knowledge in the Word when we choose to dwell on it.

## 2. Making truthful things the subject of our daily thoughtful consideration.

Summing it all up, friends, I'd say you'll do best by filling your minds and meditating on things true,

noble, reputable, authentic, compelling, gracious—the best, not the worst; the beautiful, not the ugly; things to praise, not things to curse. Put into practice what you learned from me, what you heard and saw and realized. Do that, and God, who makes everything work together, will work you into his most excellent harmonies." (Phil. 4:8-9. The message). God is a God of truth, the bible in Heb. 6:18 confirm this truth that it is impossible for Him to lie. He gives us His truth in every situation to apply to our thoughts.

So in conclusion let us briefly discuss the benefits of renewing our mind:

- As a believer in the Lord you will come to the full knowledge of the mystery of God, both of the father and of Christ. – Colossians 2:2

- You will experience the peace of God – Paul describes this in Romans 8:6 "...to be spiritually minded is life and peace."

- You will experience increased intimacy with God. God wants us to come and reason with Him. He desires for us to know His will for our lives, He desires loving relationship that has no breakage – Isaiah 1:18; Hebrew 13:21.

- You will always desire to live a life of obedience to Him. David in his words asked God to give him understanding in keeping His laws and walking in His commandments so that he might "turn away...from looking at worthless things" (Ps. 119:33-37). Having any mind other than Christ's causes us to live a life of disobedience and rebellion.

Thus as David did it will be beneficial for us at this point to plead with God for such a transformed and renewed mind like this: a mind that thinks no evil of another, but good; a mind that seeks to complement and not compete with the gift of God in his/her neighbors life. This is the mind of Christ. And I pray as we whole heartedly seek God's face in this regards, he will surely answer us speedily in Jesus name. Amen.

# Keys to Peace of Mind

**T**he relevant words are keys, peace and mind and are defined in the Webster Dictionary in the context of this discuss thus:

A key is a means of gaining or preventing entrance, possession or control.

Peace is defined as freedom from disquieting or oppressive thoughts or emotions.

Mind is defined as the element or complex of elements in an individual that feels, thinks, wills, and especially reasons.

The key to having peace of mind, is to have the Mind of Christ, which can be achieved by focusing on Christ alone, and this can be found in Colossians 2: 2, 3 - "Then you will have minds confident and at rest, focused on Christ, God's great mystery and nowhere else..." (Message Translation). We are told it is only in Christ, and nowhere else, that we can find rest, which would ultimately lead to peace of mind.

Apostle Paul further admonished in Colossians 2: 4 - "I am telling you this because I don't want anyone leading you off on some wild-goose chase, after other so-called mysteries, or 'the Secret.'" (Message Translation). In other words, we should not look too far, but just focus on Jesus, who is the mystery of God. Not in Yoga, not in modern day fanciful ways or methods.

Apostle Paul further advised we should

stop pursuing shadows and reach for the substance. In Colossians 2: 6-8, we are counselled to live Christ and be deeply rooted in Him. We should "stop studying the subject and start living it".

In Matthew 14: 25-33, we see the classical example of what happens when we cease to focus on Christ. It is the story of Jesus suspending the Law of Gravity and walking on the water. In Matthew 14: 22-34 ESV, we read:

"Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but the boat by this time was a long way from the land, beaten by the waves, for the wind was against them. And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, 'It is a ghost!' and they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, 'Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid.' And Peter answered him, 'Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.' He said, 'Come.' So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, 'Lord, save me.' Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, 'O you of little faith, why did you doubt?' And when

they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, 'Truly you are the Son of God.'"

What are the keys exemplified in this passage of the Bible?

## Key 1 - Separation (V. 22)

Just as Jesus separated himself and the disciples from the maddening crowd, at times, there is need to separate ourselves from the crowd, crisis, happenings around us to be alone with God. This would enable us to talk to and hear from God.

## Key 2 - Prayer (v. 23)

A Christian who does not pray, would soon become the prey of the evil one and ends up as meat in his mouth. Our Lord, being aware of the danger ahead, separated himself and seriously prayed for the safety of his disciples. Our Lord was in the habit of employing the keys of separation and prayer throughout his ministry on earth. In Matthew 26: 36-46, we read that at Gethsemane, just before our Lord was betrayed, He separated Himself to pray.

## Key 3 - Time (V. 25)

We learn that Jesus appeared to His disciples in the fourth watch of the night (4:00 am). In this verse, we learn the importance of not only praying, but the importance of time in prayers. The Lord appearing at 4:00 am, was here showing the importance of the hours between midnight and sunrise. We should not relent in our night vigils, because those are the hours plans of spiritual wickedness are perfected and executed in spiritual high places.

## Key 4 - Do not Fear (V. 26)

When the disciples saw Jesus walking on the water, they were afraid and thought Jesus was a ghost. To be able to have peace of mind that comes from the Lord Jesus, we need to conquer the battle against fear. Fear is one weapon Satan uses again and again, to destabilize Christians. Studies have shown that most times, the cause of our
