Norman Albert Rasch, 79, of Summerfield, Fla., formerly of Unionville, passed away unexpectedly on Sunday, July 23, 2000, at the Monroe Regional Hospital, Ocala, Fla. He was born Oct. 1, 1920, in Detroit, son of the late Norman and Alice I. (Davidson) Rasch. On June 20, 1941, he was united in marriage to Maxine Mae Raymond in Fraser. Maxine and Norman had been married for more than 59 years.
