If you are sick or unable to make it on Sunday, this is a way you can join with us to worship.

This Lenten season, we will have only three Mid-Week services: Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. The time for each to start will be 6:30 PM. The theme for this year is "So You're Getting Married?" We will examine the Jewish traditions of marriage, and see how they point us directly to the death, resurrection and return of Jesus.

COVID-19: What Has Changed

If you've been fully vaccinated:

- You can gather indoors with fully vaccinated people without wearing a mask.
- You can gather indoors with unvaccinated people from one other household (for example, visiting with relatives who all live together) without masks, unless any of those people or anyone they live with has an [increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19](#).
- If you've been around someone who has COVID-19, you do not need to stay away from others or get tested unless you have symptoms.
 - However, if you live in a group setting (like a correctional or detention facility or group home) and are around someone who has COVID-19, you should still stay away from others for 14 days and get tested, even if you don't have symptoms.

What Hasn't Changed

For now, if you've been fully vaccinated:

- You should still take steps to [protect yourself and others](#) in many situations, like wearing a mask, staying at least 6 feet apart from others, and avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated spaces. Take these precautions whenever you are:
 - In public
 - Gathering with unvaccinated people from more than one other household
 - Visiting with an unvaccinated person who is at [increased risk of severe illness or death from COVID-19](#) or who lives with a person at increased risk
- You should [still avoid medium or large-sized gatherings](#).
- You should still delay domestic and international travel. If you do travel, you'll still need to follow [CDC requirements and recommendations](#).
- You should still watch out for [symptoms of COVID-19](#), especially if you've been around someone who is sick. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, you should get tested and stay home and away from others.
- You will still need to follow guidance at your workplace.

This is taken directly from the CDC website. It is the best news this church can hope to receive. Also, The governor has gone to Stage 3—which means those who have been vaccinated and have gone through the two-week period following may attend without a mask (we are a SMALL gathering).

We'd like to, at that time, resume Coffee Time, either before or after the service, as well as Adult Bible Study. Many of you hung around afterwards in the narthex area after last Sunday's service. If there is anyone who would like to volunteer to make coffee so we could gather informally in the Fellowship Hall, please let me know. If you can let me know today, we can announce that in the bulletin for Sunday. Stay tuned for more details to come.

Holy Communion for Shut-ins

Each shut-in will receive a prepackaged communion host and wine that will have been consecrated at the altar, along with a special worship bulletin to use for Confession and Absolution, as well as a Scripture reading, Nicene Creed, The Lord's Prayer, Words of Institution to read, and a post-communion prayer and the Benediction. You will be asked to keep this handy, as it will be reused each month. The elements will be gluten-free. Please email or call Pastor Anderson to set up a time on Friday between 1pm-5pm to have communion delivered to you.
