

Rockford's Model T Connection – Part III

In the first two segments of this series we looked at auxiliary transmissions and shock absorbers for Model T's that were made right here in Rockford. This month we'll look at the Fyrac company which made timers and spark plugs for Model T's, as well as spotlights for T's and other cars. Research didn't turn up many details of the early history of the Fyrac company, but it appears at some point the company became part of National Lock which was located on the corner of 18th Avenue and 7th Street (currently occupied by the National Business and Industrial Center and a skateboard company).

At one time there were over 300 brands of Model T timers on the market, according to Tim Wanfalt, who has an extensive collection of them. Fyrac was one of those brands. The Fyrac spark plugs have a very uniquely designed, elongated electrode offering one inch of firing surface, according to their vintage advertisements. Additionally, the ads stated the plugs could withstand 150 psi of pressure without leakage. Fyrac's Night Guide windshield spotlight was also a popular accessory for Model T's and Model A's.


From this angle the lettering clearly shows ROCKFORD, ILL. and includes the color code for connecting the wires.




This vintage ad for Fyrac spark plugs shows an exploded view of the unusual electrode design



A 60 cent spark plug may seem like a bargain, but with inflation, that same plug would cost over \$10 in today's money.



The Fyrac Company was once housed here. Today the factory is mostly covered in red sheet metal, but the clock tower is still clearly visible when you pass by the building.



While often associated with the Model A, this ad from the November 10th 1923 edition of the Saturday Evening Post shows the spotlights were being sold well before the Model A was in production. The ad implies a hole was cut in the windshield glass to install the spotlight.
