## HOUSE BILL NO. 801

1 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI AND ALL POLITICAL  
2 SUBDIVISIONS OF THE STATE FROM ADOPTING OR IMPLEMENTING THE CREED,  
3 DOCTRINE, PRINCIPLE OR ANY TENET OF THE UNITED STATES RIO  
4 DECLARATION ON ENVIRONMENT AND THE STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES FOR  
5 SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT KNOWN AS "AGENDA 21" OR ANY OTHER  
6 INTERNATIONAL LAW CONTRAVENING THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED  
7 STATES OR THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; TO  
8 PROHIBIT THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI AND ALL POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS  
9 OF THE STATE FROM IMPLEMENTING PROGRAMS OF, EXPENDING ANY SUM OF  
10 MONEY FOR, BEING A MEMBER OF, RECEIVING FUNDING FROM, CONTRACTING  
11 SERVICES FROM, OR GIVING FINANCIAL OR OTHER FORMS OF AID TO THE  
12 INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL FOR LOCAL ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES OR ANY  
13 OF ITS RELATED OR AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS TO INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE  
14 LIMITED TO, COUNTDOWN 2010, LOCAL ACTION FOR BIODIVERSITY,  
15 EUROPEAN CENTER FOR NATURE CONSERVATION, THE INTERNATIONAL UNION  
16 FOR CONSERVATION OF NATURE AND THE PRESIDENT'S COUNCIL ON  
17 SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

19 **SECTION 1.** (1) As used in this section, "political  
20 subdivisions" means all states, counties, incorporated cities,  
21 unincorporated cities, public local entities, public-private  
22 partnerships and any other public entity thereof.

23 (2) The State of Mississippi and all political subdivisions  
24 thereof shall not adopt, nor implement, the creed, doctrine,  
25 principle or any tenet of the United States Rio Declaration on  
26 Environment and Development and the Statement of Principles for  
27 Sustainable Development known as "Agenda 21," adopted at the  
28 United Nations Conference on Environment and Development, held  
29 from June 3-14, 1992, in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, or any other  
30 international law contravening the Constitution of the United  
31 States or the Constitution of the State of Mississippi.

32 (3) Since the United Nations has enlisted the support of  
33 numerous independent, shadow organizations to surreptitiously



34 implement "Agenda 21" around the world, the State of Mississippi  
35 and all political subdivisions are prohibited from implementing  
36 programs of, expending any sum of money for, being a member of,  
37 receiving funding from, contracting services from, or giving  
38 financial or other forms of aid to the International Council for  
39 Local Environmental Initiatives or any of its related or  
40 affiliated organizations to include, but not be limited to,  
41 Countdown 2010, Local Action for Biodiversity, European Center for  
42 Nature Conservation, the International Union for Conservation of  
43 Nature and the President's Council on Sustainable Development,  
44 enacted on July 19, 1993, Executive Order #12852.

45       **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from  
46 and after its passage.
