More good news for Positive Images!

Bette Lepouttre continues to do Parenting on Tuesdays at 1:00 with the women living at E. Grand Blvd., the intake house for Positive Images. There can be from 2 to 9 women present who watch Bette on the big screen TV! Kudos, Bette, for your continued commitment to these women and the Positive Images Program!

A carload of household items left over from the garage sale were dropped off to Positive Images at the residential center on Coplin. Items included lamps, a vacuum cleaner, blankets, a quilt, a mirror, art work, and housewares. They were very grateful! Also, **SIGP member Jane Evola** donated dishes, sheets, and other household items. Thank you, Jane, and to all who donated to the garage sale—we have become very good at finding new homes for leftover items!

NEW GRANT FOR POSITIVE IMAGES — To help middle and high school students!

Positive Images has just received a grant to implement a substance abuse prevention program for middle and high school students. It is a two-year program where the curriculum is already designed by Life Skills. It will require additional staff to be hired and may be a challenge to fully implement under COVID restrictions for in-person teaching situations. But isn't it great that Positive Images can think about reaching out to prevent substance abuse in teens during these challenging times and taking the effort and time to write a grant to work with adolescents!

Here are some details...

"Life Skills Training (LST) is designed to target students who have not yet initiated substance use or are early stage users. The target age group for LST is early adolescence when peer groups and social pressures begin to influence children into substance use experimentation, particularly with tobacco, alcohol and marijuana. The program will serve youth between the age of 10-18 and their caregivers. The youth will predominately live in Detroit, MI zip codes 48213, 48214, 48215, and 48224.

"LST is designed to: (1) increase knowledge of the adverse consequences of substance use; (2) promote anti-drug attitudes and norms; (3) teach personal self-management skills; (4) teach general social skills; and (5) teach skills for resisting social influences to smoke, drink, use illicit drugs, and engage in aggressive or violence-related behaviors."

SIGP's Myra Golden Garage Sale was golden in every way

MENTORING FOR SUCCESS LAUNCHED!

Maddy Colavito and Diana Langlois have completed the MENTORING FOR SUCCESS initial training of mentors and mentees. The goal of this program is to be a support for our Soroptimist award winners to encourage them to finish the educational programs they are enrolled in.

Mentors and mentees have been paired:

Nancy Solak and Angeles Cervantes (Virgina Wagner Educational Award winner, 2020)

Bette Lepouttre and Lavina Hutchinson (Live Your Dream, 2nd place awardee, 2020)

Katherine Baetz and Deborah Smith (Live Your Dream, 1st place awardee, 2020)

Maddy Colavito, Karrie Blankenship and Lakissa Purnell (Live Your Dream awardee 2018)

Mentors have agreed to contact their mentee at least twice per month from September 2020 to September 2021. Both groups received a binder with pertinent information about mentoring, a Mentor/Mentee Agreement Form that was completed by both parties, 12 Monthly Participation Reports, and a booklet written by Maddy and colleagues entitled "PITFALLS AND PAYOFFS: The Challenges and Rewards of the Adult College Student."

Maddy and Diana will oversee the program and provide additional training to both mentors and mentees on a semester basis or as needed.

The next training for mentors and mentees is scheduled for November 2, on Zoom, at 7:00 p.m.

As the program develops and new awardees are selected in 2021, it is anticipated that additional SIGP members will continue this initiative to support our awardees to graduation. Contact Maddy or Diana for further information.



A call to increase voter turnout from the League of Women Voters Grosse Pointe

I am helping the League of Women Voters Grosse Pointe in a voter awareness and education programming fundraiser by selling Vote411.org lawn signs to our fellow community members. They are \$10 cash/check or \$12 PayPal on our website lwgrossepointe.org.

Vote411.org is a non-partisan website that has all the information on voting, candidate platforms, etc., that you will need for our 11/3/20 election.

I have them available on my porch: 274 La Salle Place, Grosse Pointe Farms (across from GPF City Hall) off Kerby – 3rd house on the left.

Just slip a check or cash for \$10 (in an envelope with your name on it) in my side door mail slot or go to our website listed above for a PayPal donation of \$12 and grab a sign. The extra \$2 covers the PayPal fee.

We need to get the word out so people can vote safely either by Absentee Ballot or by having all their choices ready when they go in person to vote. Thanks for your consideration!

Another opportunity to get out the vote!

SIGP members have an opportunity to participate in a NON-PARTISAN, NO COST activity you can do from home. The League of Women Voters is working with the ACLU to encourage people to vote in the upcoming general election. Volunteers are given a list of names and addresses, along with a postcard, and asked to fill in the address and write a brief message about why you feel it is important to vote. It can be a one-liner but needs to be non-partisan, and positive in nature.

Here are the logistics:

1. Text/phone or email Laura McCourt at 954-232-4398 or lauraleecook@yahoo.com. I can answer your questions and arrange delivery of the materials you need.
2. I will deliver the postcards to you.
3. The organizers need your completed postcards and list returned within a week. They supply the stamps.
4. I will pick up your completed work and deliver it to the coordinator. All cards are vetted before mailing to ensure the recipients are receiving a non-partisan comment.

SIGP member Mary Ellen Brayton is the LWVGP Director of Voter Services and in charge of this activity for the League in addition to the one in the article above.

I've already completed 25 cards—it was easy and makes me grateful for the women who did the hard work to get us the right to vote. Looking forward to hearing from you.


